

ZoomBombing

So, for our Virtual Bridge session on Thursday 2nd April, we had our first experience of ZoomBombing, where a group of individuals gatecrashed the session and shared 'irrelevant content of niche interest'. The phenomenon is similar to 'photobombing' where someone sneaks into a photography shot. Just FYI, the image on the left taken in 1853, is potentially the first example of a photobomb!

Being educators, we're not entirely unfamiliar with pranks in the classroom. It was annoying, but after a few minutes, we closed the session and re-opened it with the ability to moderate who was allowed to join. We've also locked down this page to prevent any creative editing.

So a brief moment of excitement to start the day, but then business as usual - if you do happen to be using Zoom, then we recommend you taking a look at the advice in the Scottish Business Resilience Centre's 'Cyber Security Factsheet - Zoom: Etiquette and Security' (PDF, 3205kb).

Note: There's one thing in the factsheet we don't quite agree with. You should only 'lock down' in extreme cases, as it stops people (even those with a password) from joining a session. The hosts also don't receive any notification that people are trying to enter.
