- All are welcome to attend. Registration fees are around \$250-300 per year, but the troops always find
 ways to help support those who need it financially. They have never turned a child away due to financial
 hardships.
- Scouts earn merit badges; there are over 150 merit badges that scouts can earn.
- Summer Camp is available; it is a week long camp (Sun-Sun). Cost is around \$400, but there are scholarships available.
- Every three years, the scouts do a big trip for scouts who are 14+. They included areas like the Boundary Waters, Scuba Diving, and Alaska.
- All adults/scout leaders go through the Youth Protection Training (YPT). The safety of the scouts is their number one priority.
