


Do Now:

Vocational Certification: Provides an intensive, focused training that prepares learners for work in a specific trade such as plumbing or vet technology.

Associate's Degree: Granted after a two-year course of study by a community/junior college.

Bachelor's Degree: This degree is given by a college upon completion of an undergraduate studies program, usually takes 4 years to complete.
