Aerotow Emergency Procedures

Lesson Objective

Aerotow emergency procedures include: glider can not release, towplane can not release, towplane power failure (at various times in the flight), abort of take-off near the ground, rope breaks. During this lesson segment, the student will learn the tools of recovery from these situations.

Regulatory Requirement

Pre-Solo: §61.87(i)(9)Private Pilot: PTS IV-G

Content

- Aerotow signals on the ground and in flight
- Towplane power failures or problems on takeoff and climb
- Inadvertent release on glider and/or towplane
- Tow line breaks
- Release failure for Glider and/or towplane

Completion Standards

Determine that the student

- Exhibits knowledge of the elements related to aerotow abnormal occurrences, for various situations, such as—
 - Towplane power failures or problems on takeoff and climb
 - Inadvertent release on glider and/or towplane
 - Tow line breaks
 - Release failure for Glider and/or towplane
- responds appropriately to simulated aerotow abnormal occurrences as required by the examiner.
- recognizes and responds to towplane power loss on takeoff or climb-out
- can successfully accomplish rope break recovery

The student must be able to explain

- all aerotow signals
- procedure for the double-release failure scenario (however unlikely)
- hazards of moving the glider too high on aerotow.
