(1.25 inches) The Introduction section of the article should demonstrate to the readers the significance of the study and the rationale that led to the research, including a review of relevant literature. The objectives must be stated in the final paragraph. The text should be formatted in TH SarabunPSK, 14-point, regular font, with both sides justified (Thai Distributed). No line spacing should be added between paragraphs (do not insert a blank line when beginning a new paragraph). All in-text citations must follow the APA 7th edition format as required by the Journal of SciTech-ASEAN.

2. Materials and methods (16-point, bold, left-aligned)

(1.25 inches) The materials and methods section should clearly describe the procedures undertaken in the study, depending on the type of research. If the study involves specific materials or samples, their sources and acquisition processes must be detailed. The text should be formatted in TH SarabunPSK, 14-point font, with both sides justified (Thai Distributed). No additional line spacing should be used between paragraphs (do not insert a blank line when beginning a new paragraph). Units of measurement must be written consistently throughout the entire manuscript. If abbreviations are used, they must be applied uniformly. For specialized units, the full name should be written first, followed by the abbreviation in parentheses, after which only the abbreviated form should be used throughout the manuscript.

Subheadings

If subheadings are included, they must be formatted in TH SarabunPSK, 14-point, bold font. Subheadings must be indented 0.5 inches from the left margin. The corresponding content should be written in TH SarabunPSK, 14-point, regular font, as follows:

3. Result (16-point, bold, left-aligned)

(1.25 inches) The Results section should present the findings clearly and concisely, focusing directly on the outcomes discovered in the study, arranged according to the research objectives or topics investigated. Results may be presented using tables or figures, accompanied by descriptive text that links to the corresponding table or figure. This section must be written in TH SarabunPSK, 14-point font, with both sides justified (Thai Distributed). No additional line spacing should be inserted between paragraphs (do not insert a blank line when beginning a new paragraph). Subheadings may be included as appropriate.

Subheadings

If subheadings are included, they must be formatted in TH SarabunPSK, 14-point, bold font. Subheadings must be indented 0.5 inches from the left margin. The corresponding content should be written in TH SarabunPSK, 14-point, regular font, as follows:

(1.25 inches) Figures and tables may be placed immediately after the text in which they are mentioned, after the end of a section, or on a separate page. The size of figures and tables should not exceed the width of a single column; however, if a figure or table is large, it may span across the full width of the page, provided that it remains within the specified page margin settings.

(1.25 inches) Tables must be presented in English only. Each table should be left-aligned within the column. The table number, such as "Table 1," must be written in bold, while the table title should be written in regular (non-bold) font, beginning with an uppercase letter. The main headings of each column must be centered and formatted in bold. Vertical lines are not allowed; only horizontal lines may be used.

(1.25 inches) For figures, the figure caption must be placed below the figure and centered within the column or on the page, and must be written in English. The figure number, such as "Figure 1," must be in bold, while the figure description should be in regular (non-bold) font and begin with an uppercase letter. If a figure is divided into two parts, each part must be labeled using uppercase English letters in parentheses, such as (A) and (B), with corresponding explanations provided in the caption.

Scientific names and Latin terms must be written in italics. The scientific names of microorganisms, plants, or animals must be italicized, as well as all Latin expressions, such as *in vivo*, *in vitro*, etc.

For statistical significance symbols or p-values, use lowercase italic letters, for example, p-value. p < 0.05

4. Discussion (16-point, bold, left-aligned)

(1.25 inches) The Discussion section should interpret the research findings obtained from the study. The text must be formatted in TH SarabunPSK, 14-point font, with both sides justified (Thai Distributed). No additional line spacing should be inserted between paragraphs (do not press Enter to create a blank line when beginning a new paragraph). This section should present the key findings, provide explanations based on relevant principles and theories, and relate the results to previous studies for comparison. Any additional research issues or insights should also be included here. All referenced principles, theories, or comparisons must be properly cited, and all citations must follow the journal's prescribed referencing style.

For three or more authors: (Ratseewo et al., 2025)

For organizations, use the English name of the agency in the citation. For example: (Food and Drug Administration, 2022)

5. Conclusions and recommendations (16-point, bold, left-aligned)

(1.25 inches) The Conclusion section should summarize the essential findings of the study. It should present a concise narrative highlighting the key points and provide recommendations for the application or utilization of the research results. The text must be formatted in TH SarabunPSK, 14-point font, with both sides justified (Thai Distributed). No additional line spacing should be inserted between paragraphs (do not press Enter to create a blank line when beginning a new paragraph).

6. Acknowledgements (if applicable) (16-point, bold, left-aligned)

(1.25 inches) If the authors wish to acknowledge individuals, organizations, or funding agencies that contributed to or supported the research, an acknowledgement section may be included. The text must be formatted in TH SarabunPSK, 14-point font, with both sides justified (Thai Distributed). No additional line spacing should be inserted between paragraphs (do not press Enter to create a blank line when beginning a new paragraph).

7. References (16-point, bold, left-aligned)

References must be prepared in accordance with the journal's reference formatting guidelines. The number of references should not exceed 20 sources. If more than 21 references are included, authors must follow the extended reference guidelines provided by the journal. References must follow the latest version of APA formatting, APA 7th edition; however, italicized text is not permitted and all elements must be written in regular font. All Thai-language references must be translated into English (regular, 12-point font). After translation, the phrase "(in

Thai)" must be added at the end of each reference. The reference list should be arranged alphabetically (A–Z). If the article has a DOI, it must be included at the end of the reference.
