# Getting Started...

- What is Plagiarism?

*Plagiarism means using another's work without giving them credit and saying that it is your own*

# Examples of Plagiarism...

- Copying and pasting text from online encyclopedias
- Copying and pasting text from any web site
- Using photographs, video or audio without permission or acknowledgement
- Using another student's or your parents' work and claiming it as your own *even with permission*
- Using your own work without properly citing it!

# More Examples of Plagiarism...

- Quoting a source without using quotation marks-even if you do cite it
- Citing sources you didn't use
- Getting a research paper, story, poem, or article off the Internet
- Turning in the same paper for more than one class without the permission of both teachers (this is called self-plagiarism)

## How to Avoid Plagiarism...

- Use your own words and ideas
- ***Always*** give credit to the source where you have received your information
- If you use someone's exact words - put them in quotes and give credit using **in-text citations**. Include the source in your references

# How to Avoid Plagiarism...

- If you have paraphrased someone's work, (summarizing a passage or rearranging the order of a sentence and changing some of the words)-**always give credit**
- **Take very good notes**--write down the source as you are taking notes. Do not wait until later to try and retrieve the original source
- Avoid using someone else's work with minor "**cosmetic**" changes

**1. CIRCLE or BRACKET the words or phrases that you CANNOT or don't want to change.** These words/phrases are crucial to the meaning of the passage and should not be changed because doing so would change that meaning. These might include:

- Proper nouns (unless they can be replaced by something that does not change their meaning, e.g. "Obama" → "the President")
- Statistics/specific information
- Words that are unique or difficult to find a synonym for

\*\*\*NOTE: Here's how to remember this approach: When we want to protect something, we wrap it in bubble wrap. So, we CIRCLE/WRAP the words we want to keep.\*\*\*

**2. UNDERLINE the words or phrases that you know you CAN change.**

**ORIGINAL-----→ PARAPHRASED**

People [in Chicago] <u>work</u> [in] <u>many places</u> .	Citizens in Chicago are employed in numerous locations.
[Chicago] <u>has</u> [large] <u>department</u> [stores], [banks], and [office] <u>buildings</u> .	There are many different structures in Chicago including offices, large retail stores, and banks.
The [Sears Tower], <u>which is the</u> [tallest] office [building] in [the United States], is in [Chicago].	Chicago is home to the Sears Tower, our country's tallest building.
With so [many people] trying to get to work, <u>they need ways to get around</u> .	Chicago has many people and therefore there are many modes of transportation for people who work in Chicago.
<u>Different forms</u> of [transportation] <u>move</u> <u>people from place to place</u> .	Many types of transportation help people get around.

# Helpful hints to reword passages

- It is not enough to change the words but keep the same sentence structure and order of ideas.
- Do not repeat more than three words in a row.
- **Change the order** of major **ideas** in a way that still makes sense.
- **Combine** sentences.
- **Divide sentences** into two or more.
- Use care when selecting synonyms from the thesaurus. Do not “borrow” sentences, clauses or phrases with only minor changes.
- Be sure to cite both quotes and paraphrases.
