ABSTRACT

All manuscripts must be accompanied by a 250-word (maximum) abstract. The manuscript should be written in Bahasa Indonesia and English. Please use Times New Roman 11 pt, single-spaced and justified. The abstract needs to contain (1) the background of the study (max 2 sentences); (2) the aim of the study; (3) methods (if applicable); (4) results or findings; dan (5) the conclusion.

Keywords should represent the content of your manuscript and consist of five keywords.

INTRODUCTION

The manuscript is written in Times New Roman 12 pt, single-spaced, written in one column format, on standard A4-sized paper (21 cm x 29.7 cm) between 10-15 pages long (6000-8000 words). Please use 2 cm for the top, bottom, right, and left margins. The indentation distance from the left margin is 1 cm. Please do not place any page numbers, headers, and footers in the manuscript. Manuscript should be in MS Word format (.doc or .docx).

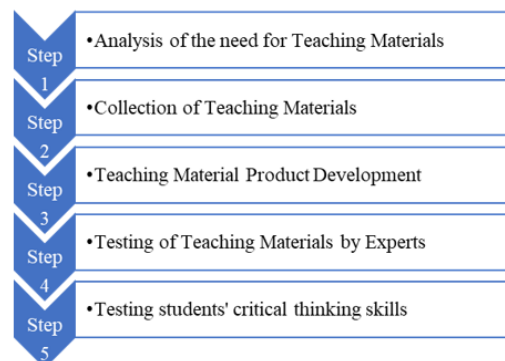


Figure 1. The Flow of Development of Teaching Materials for Evaluation.

The description of the image is at the bottom with the number, as figure 1 below.

If manuscript contains image(s), the image(s) is placed in the center of the page (centered) with 12cm- length. Ensure that if the authors take image(s) from other sources, they are required to include the sources of these images if the author doesn't make it himself. While the description of the table is at the top accompanied by the number, as table 1 below.

In the case of the manuscript containing a table, the table length cannot exceed one page. If so, it is recommended to be included in the attachment.

The introduction summarizes the fundamentals, gives a critical evaluation of the previous research study (the literature review of the last ten years), and states the aims clearly. The introduction **contains (1) the background of the study, (2) a brief literature review, (3) problems, and (4) the aims.** *The literature review is used to find research novelty. The author evaluates the previous research to find research problems and state the originality and novelty of the writing idea.* The introduction includes the fundamental issues showing that the theme/topic/title of the study is important and interesting to study. Additionally, in this section, the theoretic discourse of the important and interesting issues is presented as the focus of the study. Furthermore, issues that develop in reality related to the theoretic discourse are presented as well. Finally, the researchers find opportunities to conduct more in-depth research about the issues. This section is written in 3 pages (maximum).

This Journal accepts the original manuscript written by an individual or in a group and never published in any form. The manuscript comes from research results, article review, book review, and conceptual study. The manuscript is written in english in accordance with the scope and aims that have been determined.

RESEARCH METHODS (for research article)

Contains the types of research methods and research approaches carried out along with the steps in detail. The author must explain what is done at each stage. It is not recommended to only explain in theory without explaining the actions taken by the researcher.

RESULTS AND DISCUSSION (may be more than one subtitle)

Subtitle contains results and discussion of the study. The discussion should (1) Tell how

the paper's results contribute to answering the big questions posed in the Introduction; (2) Explains how (and why) this work agrees or disagrees with other, similar work; (3) Explains how the limitations of this study leave the big questions unanswered; (4) Tells how extensions of this paper's results will be useful for answering the big questions. The number and name of subtitles are adjusted to the main findings or discussion in the manuscript. This section is between 10-12 pages long. Note that this section may contain a table(s) and image(s).

Information originating from certain sources is required to include the quotation. An in-text citation is written using a *side note* based on APA (American Psychological Association) standard 7th edition. Example: Fahrudin (2023, p. 100), (Fahrudin, 2023, p. 100), (Fahrudin, 2023, pp. 100-101).

CONCLUSION

Consists of the highlighted findings together with their meanings concisely and must follow the purpose of writing. The conclusion is one paragraph and 400 words (max).

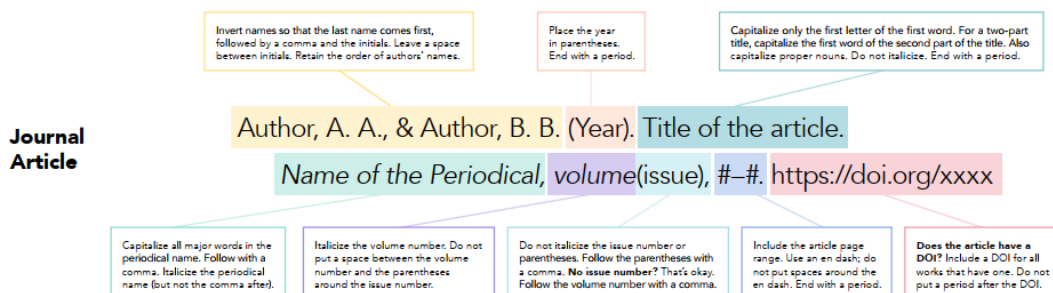
ACKNOWLEDGMENT (if applicable)

References refer to all sources used in the discussion, only references cited within the text should be included. When formatting your references, please follow the APA (*American Psychological Association*) reference style (7th Edition). In-text (citation) is strongly recommended in using citation management programs such as Mendeley, Endnote, or others. 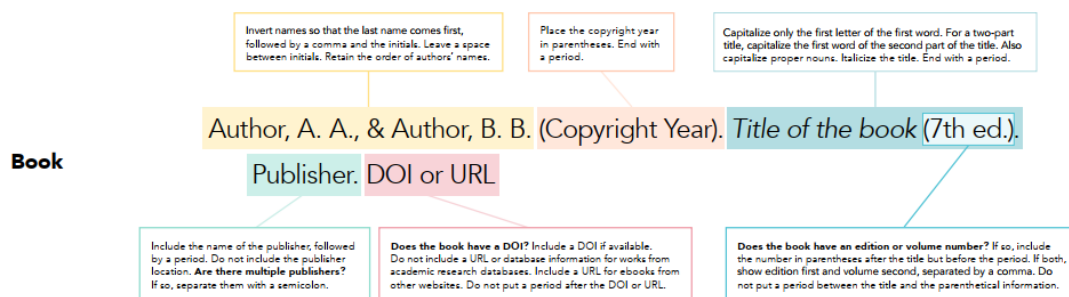


Figure 3. Reference Guide for Journal Articles and Books

SUBMISSION PREPARATION CHECKLIST

- The paper complies with the focus and scope of the journal;
- The article has significant contributions to science (covering aspects of suitability, authenticity, and high novelty);
- The paper has a compelling title (concise, straightforward, valid);
- The abstract is brief (no more than 250 words), has a complete component (goals, methods, results, conclusions) and relevant keywords;
- The introduction summarizes the fundamental, gives a critical evaluation of the previous research of study (the literature review of the last ten years) and states aims clearly;
- The research methods (for research paper) include: sources, steps, and analysis techniques are described clearly;
- The results and discussion is compliance with the purpose of writing and has clear and comprehensive interpretation;
- The conclusions sound convincing.
- The paper uses the relevant sources and has consistent and complete citations
- The language of the article is clear and communicative
- The typing format and the total number of pages according to the template (6000-8000 words)
