

12.54: End of Year Program Celebration

PHASE OVERVIEW

Mentees will identify the steps necessary to transition from high school to their post-secondary pathway. With their mentor's support, they will think through individuals they can turn to for assistance in the completion of each step.



LESSON OBJECTIVE

SWBAT reflect on the program year and their relationship with their mentor. Students will celebrate all of the work they have accomplished.

PURPOSE

In this lesson, students will celebrate the end of the program year. They will also practice an important strategy for strengthening relationships and social capital: expressing gratitude.

KEY TAKEAWAY

FACILITATOR NOTES:

This is the last lesson of the year. If you would like to change out the Learn and Engage activity with some other form of end of year celebration, you may do so. It is up to you to decide how you want to close out the program with your cohort. **Please note that this lesson will require pre-work.** You will need to insert each student's name and pathway on slides 4-6. You will need to mail merge or write out each student's name on their certificate and print it out.

Please note that there is no extended activity for this lesson as we would like for students to really take their time in drafting their final message to their mentor. If time allows, you can have students share out what they wrote about to their mentors.

Students will prepare for the superlatives activity.		
Slide 2: 5 min	TALKING POINTS <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Write your name on top of the blank paper and leave it on your desk. 2) Using the handout, read through the superlatives. We will be sharing superlatives with each other shortly - be prepared with your thoughts! 	

Learn and Engage:		Notes:
Students will use a list of pre-selected superlatives to leave positive comments and celebrate each other.		
Slide 3: 8 min	TALKING POINTS <p>When I say “go,” walk around and write a superlative on each classmate’s paper.</p> <p>The superlatives must come from the handout. You have 6 minutes.</p> <p><i>After activity:</i> Take a few minutes to read over the superlatives your classmates left! Reflect on all of the positive traits you possess. Feel free to share out any that stood out.</p>	
Slide 4-6: 6 min	TALKING POINTS <p>I am so proud of you for all the amazing work you have done this year! <insert positive reflections regarding the cohort></p> <p>You have all made it to the end of the high school program! I want to take a few minutes to shout out each and every one of you!</p> <p><i>Note: You should update the slides with your students’ name and pathway. You should hand out the certificates as you shout out each student.</i></p>	
Slide 7: 1 min	<p><i>Have a student read the key takeaway:</i></p> <p>Showing appreciation is an important life skill. It will help maintain and grow my relationships with others.</p>	
Slide 8: Mentor Connection	TALKING POINTS <p>This will be your final Platform message to your mentor! Take the time to reflect on your program experience and what you</p>	

	<p>have appreciated about working with them. There are prompts on the board to aid you, but they are not mandatory, you can just speak from the heart!</p> <p><i>Have students write to their mentors.</i></p>
