

Parent Engagement Policy

During parent-teacher conferences; 3) presented at SSC, ELAC, PTA, and scheduled Title I information meetings; 4) a copy maintained in the office 5) posted on our school website. To involve parents in the Title I, Part A programs, the following practices have been established: To involve parents in the Title I program at Park View Middle School, the following practices have been established:

To continue to include parent involvement during distance learning, parent meetings will be held via





Zoom or Google Meet to ensure that parents continue to have the opportunity to participate and be active members of the Park View community.

• The school involves parents of Title I students in an organized, ongoing, and timely way, in the planning, review, and improvement of the school's Title I programs and the Title I parental involvement policy through the above public meetings, but also in the following ways for parents to participate in our site: Back-To-School night kickoff event, parent School Plan for Student Achievement (SPSA), visits on campus, Astronomy Night, Parent-Teacher conferences, School Improvement events, and Sixth Grade Orientation.

 members of our Title I students. These events are organized and ongoing and help in the

During distance learning, teacher office hours, schedules, and email addresses have been posted so parents are aware of their opportunities to contact teachers to discuss student progress.

The regular meetings that we have scheduled throughout the year for input and information are the Title I Annual Meetings, School Site Council, English Language Advisory Committee, and the Parent Teacher Association. Advanced notice of the meetings is publicized via the posted calendar, Instagram, Facebook school flyers, agenda postings, marquee announcements, and Blackboard Connect. Links to parent meetings via Zoom/google Meet are posted and sent via text message to parents.

The school offers a flexible number of meetings for Title I, Part A parents, such as meetings in the morning or evening (ESSA Section 1116[c][2]).
