

AP Terms and Conditions

The [2026 AP® Exam Terms and Conditions](#) are available for your review. This agreement details the rules and policies students must follow related to taking the 2026 AP Exams.

- Students will be asked to accept these terms and conditions before taking each exam.
- Any updates to the terms and conditions will be clearly summarized on the terms and conditions page.

Preparing for Digital Exams

Details about digital testing for students are at bluebook.collegeboard.org/students.

- Prior to exam day, students should sign in to Bluebook using their College Board student account and try test preview questions. This will enable students to experience digital testing and try out all the tools.
- On the sign-in screen in Bluebook, students should select “**Test Your Device**” at the top right to make sure Bluebook will work on their device. It’s recommended that students do this both as soon as the test preview is available and again closer to the exam date.
- Students with approved accommodations taking digital exams with assistive technology should try a test preview with the assistive technology they plan to use on exam day. Some types of assistive technology require specific configurations. Details are at bluebook.collegeboard.org/students/accommodations-assistive-technology.
- Students taking hybrid digital exams should work with their teachers to look at a sample free-response booklet for their subject to understand what it will look like on exam day.

Nothing Builds Confidence Like Practice

- **AP Daily Practice Sessions** is a video series focused on practicing free-response and multiple-choice questions. These short, 15-minute video sessions are led by experienced AP teachers. All videos will be posted on [AP Classroom](#) and [YouTube](#) and can be watched at any time before your AP Exams. **Note:** Practice sessions are not available for AP Seminar, AP Research, AP Art and Design, and AP World Languages. However, videos on the **Review** page under **Course Resources** in AP Classroom are excellent preparation resources for these courses.
- **AP Daily: Live Review Recordings** Did you know that you’re able to view previous AP Daily: Live Review videos? Access them in [AP Classroom](#). Go to the Review page in the Course Resources section to view them. It’s never too early to start preparing.
- Click the **About the Exam** tab on any of the [course pages](#) to learn about your course’s exam. Practice for your upcoming AP Exams with questions created by the AP Program. If your exam has them, you can download free-response questions and review sample student responses and scoring guidelines from previous exams on the **About the Exam** tab of your course page.

What Students Should Bring to the Exam Room

- A government-issued or school-issued photo ID.
- A watch that isn't a smartwatch (in case the exam room doesn't have a clock that can be easily seen).
- For digital and hybrid exams: Make sure to bring your **College Board username and password**. You should log in to **BlueBook** before test day to confirm access and complete the digital readiness check.
- For digital & hybrid exams: Bring a fully charged Chromebook & charging cord.
- For paper exams: Two sharpened No. 2 pencils (with erasers) for completing multiple-choice answer sheets.
- For paper and hybrid exams: Two pens, with black or dark blue ink only, for completing areas on the exam booklet covers and for free-response questions.
- Up to 2 calculators with the necessary capabilities if they are taking an AP Biology, Calculus, Chemistry, Environmental Science, Macroeconomics, Microeconomics, Physics, or Statistics Exam. Visit apstudents.org/courses and go to the calculator policy section within their course page for the specific [calculator policy](#). A Desmos calculator is available in BlueBook for digital & hybrid exams.
- A ruler or a straight edge if they're taking an AP Physics Exam.

What Students Should Not Bring to the Exam Room**

- Electronic equipment of any kind except devices being used for digital exams.
- **Prohibited:** phones, smartwatches, smart glasses or wearable technology of any kind, laptops, tablet computers, Bluetooth devices, portable listening or recording devices, cameras or photographic equipment, devices that can access the internet, separate timers of any type, and any other electronic or communication devices.
- **Note:** School-owned and -controlled recording devices that meet AP Program criteria are allowed only for the AP French, German, Italian, and Spanish Language and Culture Exams and the AP Music Theory Exam. School-owned and -controlled computers are allowed only for the AP Chinese and Japanese Language and Culture Exams.
- Books, notebooks, compasses, correction fluid, dictionaries, highlighters, or notes.
- Mechanical pencils, No. 3 pencils, or colored pencils.
- Rulers or straightedges (these are allowed only for AP Physics Exams).
- Protractors.
- Scratch paper- The proctor will provide scratch paper for all fully digital, hybrid digital, and AP Chinese Language and Culture and AP Japanese Language and Culture Exams.
- Computers or calculators (except as previously noted).
- Reference guides, keyboard maps, or other typing instructions. (Proctors will provide any applicable reference information.)
- Watches that beep or have an alarm.
- Food or drink. (**You can only access food or drink during the break outside of the exam room space.**)
- Clothing or shoes with subject-related information.
- Head coverings (hats, hoods, brimmed caps, etc.) are not permitted while testing.
- Earplugs or headphones.
- Clipboards.
- Privacy screens.
- Separate computer monitors.

AP Exam Dates & Locations: See the table below for the exact dates and times for your exam. Your MyAP account also reflects your personal exam schedule.

- Students should report for morning exams at the beginning of first period-7:15 a.m. Students should report for afternoon exams at the beginning of 6th period-11:42 a.m. (On Wednesdays, students should report **after** 6th hour- 11:45 am.)
- **Afternoon exams will run past the regular school dismissal time.**
- Students approved by the College Board for testing accommodations will be notified individually of testing locations and accommodations.
- You are required to arrive at the appropriate location on time for each exam.
- Students may not be dismissed until an exam has officially ended; do not ask to leave early if you finish before the end of the exam.
- **Afternoon exams will run past the regular school dismissal time.** If you play a sport or have a job, it is your responsibility to inform your coach or employer of your AP Exam obligation, and arrangements should be made accordingly.
- Students will need a medical note to schedule a late exam if they miss their exam due to illness.

AP Scores

Students can view their AP scores and order additional score reports for colleges, universities, and scholarship programs online at [apscore.org](https://apcentral.collegeboard.org/apcentral/ap/scores).

- One free score report is provided to the college students designated in My AP. Students have until June 20th to designate a college.
- A credit card can be used to send scores to additional colleges.
 - To pay by check or money order, students can mail a written request to AP Services.
 - The additional reports cost \$15 for regular processing and \$25 for rush processing.

Scores become available in July. Some scores take longer to process due to later testing or other circumstances (e.g., late arrival of testing materials or extra time needed to match records). If students don't receive them by Sept. 1, they should contact AP Services.
