Brief History of the College:

Education plays a key role in shaping the citizens to turn into productive resources of the society. A philanthropic institution, “The Tandava Sugarcane Growers and The Tuni Commission Merchants Association with the unsustained cooperation from all educational philanthropists took the lead facilitating the establishment of the present institution. The Institution came into existence on 06-10-1980 and is named as TTSCG & TTCMA Government Degree College and was earlier affiliated to the Andhra University, Visakhapatnam, later on Adikavi Nannaya University, Rajamahendravaram. In the initial stage, the institution introduced BA and B.Com. as conventional courses with a small strength of 80 students.

The Institution was recognized by University Grants Commission by 2(f) and 12(B) on 02-08-1988 and came to be known as Government Degree College, Tuni. With the growing demand for science groups, a conventional course, BSc (Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry) was started in the year 1998. In tune with the changing needs of the society and importance of computer knowledge, restructured courses of BSc (Mathematics, Physics and Computer Science) and BA (Computer Applications) were introduced in the academic year 2000-2001. The nearby industrial requirements for chemists led to the choice of Post Graduation course in M.Sc (Organic Chemistry) in the year 2003 as a self-finance course.

The JKC (Jawahar Knowledge Centre) was established in 2007 which imparts employability skills and Life Skills for the students during their graduation. Further, MANA TV Lessons were telecast through SAPNET as an additional teaching supplement. The college is affiliated to Adikavi Nannaya University since 2012. With the assistance from UGC, a hostel was constructed in the premises in 2011. The College was accredited with 'B' Grade in cycle I in 2006 by NAAC, Bangalore and again was re-accredited with 'B' Grade in 2014. The College has a campus area of 22.14 acres with three blocks. It has student friendly well furnished classrooms and well-equipped laboratories for Physics, Chemistry, Computer science, Botany, Zoology and English. There are 12 departments with Conventional and Restructured UG Courses and a PG Course in MSc (Organic Chemistry). The college in its pursuance of providing quality education has added a fresh feather to its cap and acquired Autonomous Status in the year 2017. The college with the strength and autonomy in choosing new courses which are suitable to the educational demands of the nearby regions have introduced two restructured courses in science stream namely BSc (Mathematics, Chemistry, Computer Science) and BSc (Botany, Chemistry, Computer science) and one course in Commerce B.Com. (Computer Applications) in 2017. Further, in 2018 with increasing demand in the region for Life Sciences, a conventional course in BSc (Botany, Zoology, Chemistry) was introduced. B.Voc (Pharmaceutical Chemistry) and B.Com. (Accounting & Taxation) were introduced in the year 2020. The Restructured courses B.Sc. (M.P.WT) was introduced in the year 2021. BBA (Event Management) was started in the year 2022. UG Programs, (Honors) Single major with minor were started from the academic year 2023-2024.

Details available in Annexure-IV.

Resolutions: After examine Annexure-IV. the Council resolved the UG Curriculum, Single Major Stream pattern-Skill Courses for I to IV Semesters- preferred faculty to teach Computer Proficiency Courses i.e., Digital Literacy, ICT and Cyber Security; allotment of hours with credits of Skill Courses.

8.6(b) Approval of Skill Courses, Multidisciplinary Courses, credits and assessment procedure issued by APSCHE and CCE for the academic year 2024-2025.

Discussion: The council discussed on all Single Major Programs. Among the **FIVE** Skill Courses, students may opt any **TWO** Skill Courses in Semester-I & II; in Semester-III & IV, students may opt any **ONE** Skill Course among 4 Skill Courses whereas in Multidisciplinary courses, student may opt **ONE** among **SIX** in Semester- I, III & IV Multidisciplinary Courses. Reference in Annexure-V

Resolution: The council resolved Skill Courses and multidisciplinary courses in UG program structure for I & II year for the academic year 2024-2025.

8.6 (c) Approval of implementation of English Proficiency Courses in semester -III & semester-IV/ OSD Q-I and workload with assessment pattern by CCE, Mangalagiri.

Discussion: The discussion was made on the implementation of English Proficiency courses in semester-III & semester-IV/ OSD Q-I by CCE, English Proficiency for Career Development-1 in semester-III & English Proficiency for Career Development-2 in semester-IV with effect from the academic year 2024-2025. 3 hours per week and total number of hours for teaching is 44.

Formative Assessment Test for 300 marks –to be scale down to 60 marks.

Summative Assessment (final test) (viva and written test): F2F/video based (to be recorded for assessment) =100 marks-to be scale down to 40 marks (50 marks for Oral Skills and 50 marks for written skills which will be tested on Google docs). Details available in Annexure -VI

Resolutions: The Council approved the implementation of English Proficiency Courses in semester -III & semester -IV/ OSD Q-I and workload with assessment pattern by CCE, Mangalagiri.

8.7 Approval of distribution and weightage of marks for Continuous Internal Assessment and Semester End Examinations.

Discussion: The council discussed on the distribution of marks for the Continuous Internal Assessment and Semester End Examinations as per the guidelines of AKNU that is 30:70 for I, II & III year students for the academic year 2024-2025.

Resolution: The Council approved the distribution and weightage of marks of Continuous Internal Assessment and Semester End Examination of I, II & III year degree students for the academic year 2024-2025.

8.8 Approval of Continuous Internal Assessment for the academic year 2024-2025.

Discussion: The council discussed on Mid-I and Mid-II exam pattern for all Single Major Programs is in MCQS which were conducted by the frame work, approved in BOS, will be conducted as per the guidelines of APSCHE for common courses of single major programs whereas languages follow the Descriptive pattern which is approved in BOS. For II & III year programs, the assessment is for 50 marks and it is scale down to 30 marks. First internal exam is for 20 marks, Second internal exam is for 15 marks, assignment for 5 marks, seminars/PPT/worksheets/ role play etc., 5 marks, Extra-curricular activities like clean and Green, NSS and attendance for 5 marks. **As per the suggestion of the Vice Chancellor of Adikavi Nannaya University, Prof. Y.**

SrinivasaRao Sir, for First year Degree w.e.f 2024-2025 admitted batch, the assessment is for 55 marks and it is scale down to 30 marks. First internal exam is for 20 marks, Second internal exam is for 20 marks, assignment for 5 marks, seminars/PPT/worksheets/ role play etc., 5 marks, Extra-curricular activities like clean and Green, NSS and attendance for 5 marks.

There is no minimum pass mark in Continuous Internal Assessment.

Resolution: The Council has approved the II & III year programs Continuous Internal Assessment and scale down to 30 marks for the academic year 2024-2025. And also approved the Internal Assessment pattern of Degree I year w.e.f 2024-2025, total Internal marks 55, and its scale down to 30 marks is approved by the Council.

8.9 Approval of Semester End Examination (SEE) for the academic year 2024-2025.

Discussion: The council discussed on the Semester End Examinations in each course. There are two sections. From Section A, student should attempt 5 essay questions out of 8 essay questions, each question carries 10 marks. From Section B, student

should attempt 4 short questions out of 6 short questions, each question carries 5 marks for the I year (second semester), II year (third and fourth semesters) and III year (Fifth semester); students for the academic year 2024-2025. The minimum pass percentage of Semester End Examination is 35% and overall pass mark to be 40 out of 100 marks (CIA+SEE). For Practicals II, III, IV & V Semester, pass mark will be 20 out of 50 marks. There are two Fundamental courses for UG Honors program in semester-I. These courses will adopt an objective format encompassing multiple choice questions, completion exercises, matching exercises, concise one-word responses and succinct one sentence responses. Question paper pattern is in Annexure-VII with Bloom's Taxonomy. Four series of question paper cum answer booklets marked A, B, C & D will be prepared jumbled with equal weightage for all units of the syllabus.

Key for question paper series should be provided and it is under the custody of Controller of Examination.

Candidates are informed that the online admission process comprising of registration, payment of processing fee will commence from 02.07.2024 and pending certificate verification at HLCs will commence from 05.07.2024.

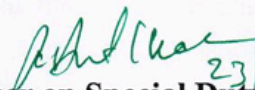

The APCCE has been successfully reaching several milestones in offering quality education to the marginalized students of Andhra Pradesh. A tremendous growth has been recorded in the quality parameters of the colleges during the recent years due to the qualitative initiatives implemented from time to time.

As Skill Development and Employability of the UG students form the top priority areas of outcome-based education, the students should be involved in problem based and peer-group teaching - learning procedures. The students should be involved in various participative activities to improve communication skills, negotiation skills and leadership qualities.

A lacuna was created in language teaching due to the introduction of the NEP and Single Major Courses. Hence, two courses for Semester III and IV viz – **English Proficiency for Career Development -1** and **English Proficiency for Career Development-2** are designed by trained faculty for the benefit of the students in 3rd and 4th semesters. These courses are designed in association with the EFLU, keeping in mind the design of Assessment Tests and Interviews conducted by Big 4 companies and are proposed to be implemented from the Academic Year 2024-25.
