- 5. What questions can we answer for you about the role or the Council?

Vianney Forewah	The candidate did attend the interviews as scheduled. The reason was not communicated	We shouldn't move forward with the candidate
Yan Kay Ho (UK)	The candidate has vast experience in managing communities and facilitating inter-community conversations. There was clear interest in joining the Council despite the many roles she holds.	The Candidate should be approved. Her experiences and talents would be of great value to building and growth.
Dara Obademi (Nigeria)	Dara is an electrical engineer based in Nigeria. Although his experience with open science hardware is limited, he expressed a willingness to learn.	The candidate should be approved as the African representative. He also brings unique talents necessary for community growth.
Maria Castelló (Uruguay)	Maria is a seasoned neuroscientist with experience in makerspaces and building synergies with like-minded institutions.	The candidate should be approved as the South America representative. She is familiar with GOSH, and the Council will benefit from her vast knowledge.
