Pastor Megan's Peaceful Ponderings

The election of Pope Leo the XIV this past month got me thinking a bit about what church's call their leadership, and what those leadership roles mean in various church bodies. While there was understandably a good amount of news coverage talking about everything from who elects the new pope to how they make the smoke that sends up the results of each vote out to the world, there is considerably less public awareness about how leaders in other other church bodies elect their leadership, and even less awareness of what that leadership does. Since I can only claim to have a true understanding of how this process works in the ELCA, and since our synod had a Bishop's election at our Synod Assembly this past May, I thought now might be a good time to talk about what it means to be a Bishop in the ELCA, and how we elect them.

To start with, it is important that you understand two things about the ELCA. One is that it is not a hierarchy. The Synod and National Church Bodies exist as equal and overlapping expressions of the church alongside Congregations. This means that a Bishop in the ELCA cannot take away a church's property, close a church down, or dictate worship practices or policies. They are not more powerful bodies of the church, they are just different church bodies that operate at a state or national level.

The Second thing that is vital to understand is that Bishops are always elected in assembly (either synod or national) and the voting membership of each assembly in the ELCA is made up of 60% lay people (non-clergy) and 40% active and retired clergy. That means that the most powerful voice in an ELCA assembly comes from the people sitting in the pews. This is why I find it so important for people to stay in touch with our synod and national church bodies. You can do this by subscribing to the synod newsletter at

A Bishop serves a 6 year term in the ELCA. Depending on the synod, there may or may not be limits to how many terms a bishop can serve. Our synod, the Northwest Lower MI Synod, does not have term limits.

The role of a bishop in the ELCA is to work with synod council and synod staff to care for the pastors and congregations of the synod in many ways, including but not limited to;

- They are a link between the synod and churchwide.
- Providing guidance and accountability for Pastors and lay people looking to serve as rostered leaders.
- Helping congregation and pastor navigate change and conflict
- Bringing Congregations together to achieve larger goals, such as working with our Global Mission Partners, dealing with social issues, and helping offer learning events for pastors and lay people.
- Offering guidance, care, and inspiration to pastors and congregations throughout the synod.

A bishop is elected through a series of prayerful votes, and there are no nominees when the voting starts. It is an Ecclesiastical Ballot, which means that after prayer, voting members may write down the name of any ordained pastor in the ELCA that they feel would make a good Bishop. If someone gets 3/4s of the votes on the first ballot, they are elected. If not, the top seven vote getters are put on the second ballot. If one of them gets 3/4s of the vote, they are elected, if they don't, we go through a series of profiles, interviews, question and answers, and more votes, all done in the midst of prayer and worship. As the votes progress, candidates are eliminated, and you need less total votes to be elected. Finally if we make it all the way to the 5th ballot, there are only two names left, and the winner just needs a simple majority.

This can be a fascinating and spiritual process, one I find I like a lot better than most of the other elections I've seen recently. I've heard the process called the world's strangest job interview, but what it really is, is a group discernment process, in which we invite the Holy Spirit to guide us as we come together to elect leadership for the church. Everything from who the voters will be to how the process will unfold invites the Holy Spirit in and asks God to grant us wisdom, vision, compassion, and guidance as we discern who our bishop should be. I consider myself blessed to be a part of this, and I encourage you to learn more about the synod and our bishop by visiting https://www.mittensynod.org/.

Synod Assembly Report

Our synod met in assembly May 18th-May 20th. At the meeting roughly 262 people representing congregations and worshiping communities from across our synod met in Mount Pleasant to worship, learn, and do the business of the church. This business included

- Adopting a synod budget for 2027
- Adopting compensation guidelines for 2026
- Memorializing the National Church Body to continue and expand its efforts IN SUPPORT OF ADDRESSING THE LEGACY OF AMERICAN INDIAN BOARDING SCHOOLS IN THE UNITED STATES
- Electing new members to synod council, the synod consultation committee, and the synod disciplinary committee.
- Electing a Bishop for our synod for the next 6 years. (please see pastoral report)
- And much more!

Thank you to Barb and Bill Paulines who served as voting members from Peace Lutheran Church along Pastor Megan. Please note that all each synod assembly is made up of 60% lay people (non-clergy) and 40% active and retired clergy.

Since 2023 Peace Lutheran has had a caring ministry to inmates in our local jail who are those most in need.

Every two weeks Ron Iseler visits the jail and meets with the administrator. The administrator determines which inmates have been indigent for at least two weeks. We then deposit a small \$30 to their commissary account along with a message that it is from Peace Lutheran, and a reminder that they are loved by God.

Staff at the jail reports that the most frequently purchased items are socks, phone cards, lotion, and ramen noodles. And, that these gifts are received with surprise, gratitude, and often, with tears. Last year we helped care for 24 individuals. You can support this ministry by placing donations in the Blue Fund of the Month box in the narthex throughout the month
