

# 6<sup>th</sup> Grade NoodleTools: Lesson 6


## ***website citation and notecards***

Lesson Objectives: to practice using the features in NoodleTools before a research project begins and to learn more about the Crane visiting author, Lydia Kang.

### **PART 1**

Step 1: Click on the NoodleTools link on the 6th grade Library Skills LibGuide use the **Microsoft 365** button to login using your **RPCS email**.

Step 2: Press the green “**New Project**” button in the top right, in the box, name your project: **YourLastName\_**, MLA, and starter then Submit (see the picture below for a sample)

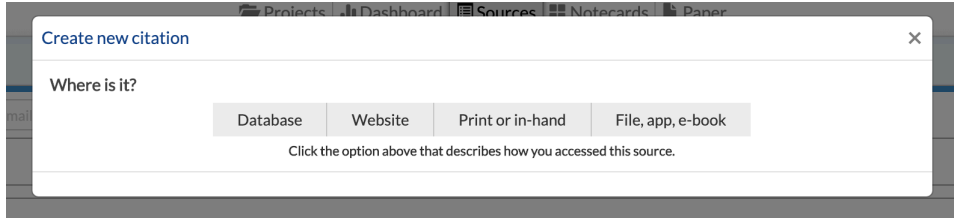

Step 3: Next you will hover over your project so that it turns gray. You will see a plus sign below the word sharing. Click on the plus sign and then click on the **Share with a Project Inbox** button, and type in **6 Lydia Kang** and then click the blue **DONE** button to share with my project inbox. Now I can see your good work!

Step 5: Click on your project to open it. Now let's add our first source! We'll use one of the websites about Lydia Kang in the Crane Lecture Visiting Author box to create our first website citation.

Step 6: Click the green **New Source** button at the top right side of the page. Which type of source are we using?



Step 7: Once you have decided on a source type, you will be able to fill in the fields of source information. Try to find and add the correct information into each box in the NoodleTools form. You may not be able to find some of the information and that's okay! Just fill in what you can find and then click SAVE. Now I can check your work in the project inbox.

## PART 2

Step 1: Use one of the Lydia Kang websites (from the 6th Grade Library Skills LibGuide) which you have already cited, to read more about her and then take notes that correspond to the following questions.

Step 2: In your 6 Lydia Kang project. Click the green "New Notecard" button in the top right corner. We will make one notecard for each of the following questions:

- Where did Lydia Kang go to college after RPCS? What academic field did she pursue after college?
- Where does Lydia Kang live now?
- How is her book, *Quackery*, described on her website?

### **Your notecards must include:**

- The correct website citation listed in the source area
- A title that corresponds to your question (shorten the question to essential words)
- A direct quote found on the website (in Direct Quotation box)
- A question for Ms. Kang related to this fact or about a personal connection to her experiences (in the Original Thinking box)
