2024-2025 LCYLS Queen Candidates Requirements and Responsibilities

- 1. Your fair participation sheet, pictures, and essay are due at the time of our final fair queen meeting.
 - A. **Essay** You will need to turn-in 4 copies of the essay by the due date listed above. (This will be provided in each judge's packet prior to the interviews)
 - B. **Pictures** You will need to turn-in (3) 4x6 (This will be judged for Miss Photogenic and go on the front of your folders for the judges) and (1) 8x10 (This will be displayed at the Queen's Coronation and the duration of the Fair) color portrait. Please keep the picture the same across all four copies. These are due by the date listed above. These pictures need to be in **portrait orientation** (vertical). *These pictures are to be unaltered in any way (no photoshop, filters, etc.)*. Your photo should be one that best displays your personality.
 - C. **Fair participation sheet-** see attached sheet. This needs to be completed in full and submitted by the due date listed above.
- 2. You will be provided with a sash to wear during the interviews, the night of the coronation, during the fair and/or designated functions. You may NOT wear the sash in the show ring while you are showing your project or selling your animal at the auction.
- 3. While meetings are highly encouraged to attend, you can miss meetings and still run for Fair Queen.
- 4. You will be required to work a minimum of two showrings. Sign-ups for those duties will happen at the final meeting.
- 5. You will be required to work at the Buyers Dinner and Auction. If you have a project that is being auctioned, you will be allowed time to prepare for the sale of your project. After the sale of your project, you will be required to continue working the auction. All cell phones should be put away during the buyer's dinner and auction.
- 6. We ask that each candidate conduct themselves in a lady-like fashion at all times while representing The Leon County Youth Livestock Show. Please remember you are looked up to by your peers and members of the community. You will be required to follow the dress code set forth by the gueen committee. See attached dress code policy.

7. If you do not participate in the fair set up day, your time in the show ring, the auction, and/or fair clean up day, you will be ineligible to compete in the Queen's Contest the following year.

LCYLS Queen Contest Rules

- 1. The Leon County Youth Livestock Show (LCYLS), Inc. reserves for its Officers and Board of Directors the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions and differences in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of, connected with or incidental to the Fair. The Management reserves the right to modify, change or add to these rules as it, in its judgment, may deem advisable. *Any person who violates any of the general rules or specific rules of the Leon County Youth Livestock Show will forfeit all privileges and premiums won.* The LCYLS, Inc. will not be held legally responsible for any damages or injuries to any persons, personal properties, exhibitors, exhibits or livestock while on the grounds or in transit thereto or there from or any cause whatsoever!
- 2. Contestant must be a single high school girl living in Leon County or enrolled in a Leon County high school, be a representative of a local organization, and academically qualified according to House Bill "72". Fair Queen Candidates may never have been married or have had children or be pregnant at the time of the coronation. If the Fair Queen becomes pregnant or is married during her reign, she will be required to relinquish her title, crown, sash, and belt buckle.
- 3. Fair Queen Candidates and the Fair Queen must not have been charged with or convicted of any criminal offense. This includes but is not limited to misdemeanors (such as minor-in-possession, driving under the influence, criminal mischief, destruction of property, etc.; apart from minor traffic violations). Additionally, there must be no adjudications presently pending against the candidate.
- 4. Any girl, other than a previous Fair Queen, is eligible to participate as a candidate provided she meets the other qualifications.
- 5. Each contestant must participate in the LCYLS by having an entry in at least one division of the fair (this includes Ag Mechanics). All entry fees and /or late fees must be paid by the deadline set forth by the LCYLS or the contestant will be disqualified from the Queen's contest.
- 6. Each contestant must be an active member of FFA or 4H prior to January 1, 2025.
- 7. All contestants must attend a Tea Party on the day of the pageant. Interviews will be done immediately following. Contestants will be judged in appearance, poise, personality, and general knowledge and involvement in the LCYLS.
- 8. Each applicant's official entry form and the \$100 entry fee, must be received by the Superintendent of the Queen Committee OR Cassie Ferguson (not mailed) no later than 5pm on

January 31, 2025. Applications must be complete. **No late applications will be accepted.** All rules will apply as of entry due date.

- 9. The Fair Queen will receive a sash, crown, belt buckle, and a cash prize.
- 10. Fair Queen Candidates must agree to be personally interviewed by judges and understand that the decision of the judging panel is final. Judges' scoresheets will remain confidential and become property of the LCYLS Queen Committee.
- 11. Fair Queen Candidates must be of good moral character. If any candidate or Fair Queen is deemed to participate in inappropriate comments, immoral or indecent acts or behavior in any way, including but not limited to unsportsmanlike conduct in the ring, disrespectful interactions with the LCYLS Board of Directors and/or Superintendents (including before, during, or after the 2025 LCYLS), and social media (Facebook, Twitter, and the like) that candidate will be ineligible for the contest. If any Fair Queen Candidate is found to have engaged in any immoral or indecent acts, the Fair Queen Candidates may be found ineligible.
- 12. All decisions by the Queen contest judges, the Queen's committee, and the LCYLS Board of Directors are final.

LCYLS Queen Candidate Dress Code

As a participant in the LCYLS Queen Contest, you are looked upon by both children and adults in your community. We ask that you maintain a sense of respect of yourselves. A general rule of thumb to follow is to not wear anything that you wouldn't wear showing your animal in the show ring. We have developed a written dress code that you will be required to follow at all times when you are at the Leon County Expo Center. This dress code is also to be followed at any other events and/or locations where you a representing the LCYLS.

- *No spaghetti strap, strapless, or off-the-shoulder tops
- *No low-cut, provocative tops
- *No backless tops
- *No tops that do not completely cover your mid-section

*No shorts

*No jeans with complete rips and/or tears that expose skin
