What is Industrial-Organizational (I-O) Psychology?

<u>I-O</u> is the scientific study of human behavior in organizations and the workplace. Some key topic areas include employee recruitment, selection, training and development, performance measurement, leadership, workplace motivation, teams, job satisfaction and turnover, quality of work life, work stress and health, structure of work, ethical and legal issues, organizational culture, and organizational development.
