

# Spring JCTC/JCPS Online Class Dual Credit Enrollment Process

General Information Concerning Jefferson Dual Credit Spring 2024 online course registration with JCPS high schools and participating private schools

Online dual credit classes start 1/8/24 and finish the week of 5/5/24. Students and parents/guardians can visit Jefferson's updated <u>web page</u> for general information on dual credit.

### Basic Requirements for General Education Classes

Students must meet KCTCS college readiness benchmarks <u>and any course specific prerequisites</u> to enroll in dual credit courses. We have listed the <u>basic</u> requirements below and specific course prerequisites in the class listing at the end of this document.

- Non-Math Courses:
  - o 3.0 Cumulative GPA
  - o **OR** ACT Reading 20 AND ACT English 18
  - o **AND** any course specific requirements listed in the college catalog (see list below)
- MATH 146 Contemporary College Math
  - o 3.0 Cumulative GPA
  - o OR ACT Math 19
- MATH 150 College Algebra
  - o 3.2 Cumulative GPA
  - o OR ACT Math 22





TO TAKE ONLINE DUAL CREDIT CLASSES WITH JCTC, STUDENTS MUST FOLLOW THE PROCESS OUTLINED BELOW. STEPS INCLUDE: APPLY TO THE COLLEGE, COMPLETE THE ENROLLMENT AGREEMENT, COMPLETE CLASS PREFERENCE GOOGLE FORM, COMPLETE ORIENTATION FORM, ATTEND VIRTUAL ORIENTATION AND ACITVATE STUDENT ACCOUNT. WE HAVE LAID OUT THE STEPS BELOW AND PROVIDED LINKS TO REQUIRED ACTIONS.

If a student is taking a dual credit class with JCTC for Fall 2023, they just need to complete the class preference google form. If they did not take a DC class in Fall 2023, they will need to complete the entire process.

- 1. October 12 High Schools notified of process and Early Registration opens.
- 2. Beginning October 12 Students not taking a Fall 2023 class, complete application to the college, complete dual credit enrollment agreement with parent/guardian and complete the Orientation Form [Dual Credit Application Process] Control Click to access the application process. Please complete the first two steps prior to being registered for a class and steps three and four after you are registered for a class and have been notified in your email.
- 3. **Beginning October 12** Students may begin setting their preferences using this link: <u>JCTC dual credit</u> online preference form for Spring 2024
- 4. **Beginning October 18** High school counselors are notified weekly of students completing class preference and their enrollment status. This helps to identify students that are missing items that prevent registration.
- 5. **Beginning October 18** High schools send dual credit office copy of HS transcript with eligible GPA scores
- 6. Beginning October 18 Dual credit office begins registering students and notifies students by email
- 7. **November 30 5 PM** Early registration students attend online orientation held virtually through Microsoft Teams Invitation will be sent the Friday prior to students through Microsoft Teams-Parents/guardians are encouraged to attend. High School Principals, Counselors and Academic Coaches are welcome to attend. Students that have not taken a JCTC dual credit course previously must attend one of the two virtual orientations.
- 8. December 14 Last call for student to complete preference sheet and complete application process
- 9. December 14 Last date for counselors to submit HS transcript and approve student for DC enrollment
- 10. **December 14** Last opportunity for student to attend virtual Microsoft Teams orientation. Invitation will be sent the Friday prior to students through Microsoft Teams- Parents/guardians are encouraged to





attend. High School Principals, Counselors and Academic Coaches are welcome to attend. Students that have not taken a JCTC dual credit course previously must attend one of the two virtual orientations.

11. Jan 8 Dual credit classes start. Students must Login to Blackboard to get started

If you are in a private school and choose one of these courses, you will not have a KHEAA scholarship to cover the tuition for that course.
