

Community Organiser Student Representative Role Description 2025/26

The Community Organiser Student Representatives will champion change by empowering students to act on the issues that matter to them by building power within the student body. This role is about listening to your peers, identifying shared concerns, and helping to develop and drive grassroots campaigns. Alongside this the Community Organiser Student Representatives will champion campaigns to ensure that the needs of students and the community are reflected through the activities of the Union. You may also drive forward campaigns and key areas of change that seek to tackle discrimination, raise awareness of issues faced by students and celebrate the diverse cultures all around us. This role will also see you working to build engagement and participation from fellow students across the University.

As a Community Organiser Student Representative your purpose will be to:

- Represent students and the diverse student community.
- Campaign on issues relevant to students and the community.
- Work with the Full Time Officers and wider student body on issues relating to students.
- Lead and support in planning key Liberation and History Months and community events e.g.,
 Black History Month, LGBT+ History Month ensuring they are impactful and student led.
- Scrutinise the Full Time Officer Campaigns to ensure they are student centric with their campaigns.

As the Community Organise Student Representative you will:

- Represent students and the community at Christ Church by gathering regular student centric feedback.
- Campaign on issues relevant to students and the community.
- Be a part of the Student Representative teams channel to collaborate with other Community
 Organiser Representatives and the Full Time Officers.
- Attend Student Representative meetings.
- Attend training provided by the Students' Union.
- Work alongside marginalised groups to tackle specific issues.
- Give student groups a voice, communicating their issues to the relevant bodies at the University.
- Ensure you work alongside our values of being Inclusive, Supportive, Exciting, Dependable,



Ambitious and Independent and our policies and legal responsibilities e.g. GDPR.

As the Community Organiser Student Representative you might:

- Lead or assist in coordinating events for students and the community.
- Engage with local and national campaigns and bodies.
- Collaborate with relevant student societies to run events for students.

As a Community Organiser Student Representative you will:

- Ensure your work is influenced by student needs and opinion building power within the student body.
- Represent and engage with students of all types of study at all campuses.
- Work and support your team of fellow Student Representatives.
- Be ready and willing to accept actions from the Community Organisers Meetings and engage positively in the process.
- Run campaigns alongside your fellow Student Representatives, raising awareness of issues affecting students.

Benefits and skills from the role:

- You will gain a good understanding of liberation issues.
- You will gain experience of running and facilitating events.
- You will gain experience of building relationships with a range of stakeholders.
- You will gain experience of planning and leading campaigns.
- You will have access to training and development opportunities.
- You will gain experience of working in a team and working collaboratively.

Community organisers play a key role in amplifying less heard student voices. As such, we especially encourage applications from Global Majority students, LGBTIA+ Students, Commuting Students and Students with caring responsibilities but all applications welcome!
