Quotation Analysis Worksheet

Instructions: Using the following thesis statement from *The Pearl* by John Steinbeck, please write some analysis sentences to come after the following integrated quotations and help support the thesis statement.

LSU THESIS: Kino's obsession with the pearl leads to the destruction of his marriage.

1. When Juana claims that the pearl will destroy their family, even Coyotito, Kino does not listen to her and instead tells her to be quiet: "Hush... In the morning we will sell the pearl, and then the evil will be gone, and only the good remain. Now hush, my wife" (Steinbeck 38).

2. Again, after Juana repeatedly attempts to get Kino to throw the pearl into the ocean, as she believes that it is evil, Kino shuts her down, saying, "No... I will fight this thing. I will win over it... Hush... I am a man" (Steinbeck 55-56).

3. When Kino discovers that Juana is about to throw the pearl into the ocean, "he leaped at her and caught her arm and wrenched the pearl from her." Due to his anger, he "struck her in the face with his clenched fist... and kicked her in the side" (Steinbeck 57).
