- 1. GPA Requirement:
 - Maintain a GPA of 3.0 or higher
- 2. Course Completion:
- Successfully complete Algebra 1, Algebra 2, Geometry, and Prop/Stats/Pre-Calculus

With 75 or higher

-English 1, 2, 3, 4 with a grade of 75 or higher

Or pass the Accuplacer test with 250 or higher on the Reading section & 263 on the Math Section or Higher

- 3. Good Attendance:
 - Demonstrate consistent attendance and punctuality.
- 4. Self-Advocacy Skills:
- Exhibit the ability to advocate for oneself in academic and personal matters.
- 5. Digital Literacy:
 - Be proficient in checking and responding to emails effectively.
- 6. Independent Work Ethic:
- Demonstrate the capability to work independently and manage coursework effectively.
- 7. Responsible:
 - Show responsibility in handling academic tasks and commitments.
- 8. Trustworthy:
- Because students will be on a college campus, demonstrate trustworthiness and responsible behavior.
- 9. Able to balance high school workload and college workload:
- Show readiness and ability to manage the demands of both high school and college coursework.
- 10. No major discipline referrals:
 - Maintain a record free of major disciplinary issues.
