Dear TCIS Community Members,

I am extremely proud of the start we have had to this school year. TCIS has put forth a sound program and plan and the school community has come together. Though we have had some minor issues to start the year such as pick-up and drop-off, some canteen adjustments, it has generally been extremely positive.

A few things and dates I would like to share with you:

- A. Pick-up and drop-off. The dropping off of your children at school has been very effective and we are able to maintain safety standards. The pick-up has been less smooth and so we are adjusting the afternoon pick-up for the Elementary School. Beginning on the 17th all Elementary students will be brought to the Canteen for pick up. Essentially, afternoon pick up will mirror morning drop-off. MS and HS students will leave as parents arrive at the gate. Please remember that students must vacate the campus by 4p.m. as there are no after school activities or supervision beyond this time. Thank you for your cooperation.
- B. Compensation Songkran Holidays. The Government of Thailand has announced two additional days for Songkran, September 4th and 7th. We have already had our Songkran holidays for 2020 and need not incur any more days off as this would mean calendar adjustments in order to get the 180 school days adhered to as stipulated in our official calendar. Please be advised that September 4th had already been designated a teacher Professional Development Day on the calendar. This will not change and means that students will not be in school on that day. Any parent who decides to also keep their child out of school on the 7th of September are asked to inform the appropriate divisional office. Students will receive an excused absence if parents inform the school and there will be no consequence for the absence.
- C. September 11th. This is a scheduled parent teacher conference day and will proceed as scheduled.
- D. Incoming teachers. This has been a difficult year worldwide for movement of any kind. With the government wisely not allowing commercial flights and the conditions for ASQ's and Covid testing, it has been difficult to get our teachers on site. Regardless, we have kept a qualified teacher with your children and the teachers have taught remotely from wherever they are in the world. The good news is that they begin to arrive! Last week our music teacher, Mr. Cary arrived at the school after completing his quarantine. Currently, several others are completing their quarantine and will be on campus after that. The few remaining are all scheduled for returns in the near future. As I meet with other Heads of Schools, I hear of similar situations and am grateful for the level of professionalism that our staff exudes.

親愛的泰國中華國際學校的成員們:

我為學校從開學到現在為止的表現感到非常自豪。 TCIS制定了完善的計劃和策略,學校的所有成員也都合作無間。 儘管開學前幾天我們遇到了一些小問題,例如上下學接送,餐廳的調整等,但總體上學校的表現還是非常優秀的。

以下有幾件事情與您分享:


- A. 上下學接送: 上午孩子上學期間非常順利,我們都能夠維持安全程序讓學生進入校園。 放學的程序則不太順利,因此我們須調整小學的放學程序。從8月17日開始,所有小學生都將被帶到餐廳等待家長接回家。希望這樣的改變,能讓下午家長接學生放學的程序,如同上學一樣順利。中學和高中的學生將在家長抵達校門時離開。請記住,學生必須在下午4點之前離開校園。因為4點之後學校沒有課後活動,謝謝您的合作。
- B. 宋干節補假:泰國政府宣布將在9月4日和7日放兩天宋干節假期。 學校之前已經放過宋干節假期,因此,這兩天無需再放假,學校還是維持本學年規定的180天教學日。 請注意,9月4日是教師專業進修日。 這不會改變,學生當天無須上學。 家長要讓貴子弟在9月7日請假者,應事先通知學校。 如果家長沒通知學校且學生不到校者,學生將被記錄為無故缺席。
- C. 9月11日懇親會如期舉行。
- D. 新聘老師: 不管是對任何的行業來說, 今年都是艱難的一年。 由於政府宣布禁止商業航班入境以及所有入境人員須符合集中檢疫旅館隔離和預先作新冠肺炎測試等規定, 因此很難讓我們的新聘的老師回到學校上班。 無論如何, 我們已新聘合格的老師, 這些新聘的老師正在泰國以外的地方為貴子弟進行遠距線上課程。 好消息是他們正開始回校! 上週, 我們新聘的音樂老師Cary檢疫完畢後回到了學校教書。 目前, 其他幾個老師正在檢疫中, 並即將回校。 剩下的幾個老師也計劃在不久的將來在檢疫後回到學校教書。 當我與其他學校的行政人員開會時, 我也聽到了類似的情況, 對於我們的教職員所表現出的專業水平, 我深表感謝。

最後,您會發現政府最近宣布了某些檢疫規定的改變,泰國公立學校已完全開放至上課時正常的社交 距離。 TCIS已根據泰國政府的規定進行課程,並將維持目前的運營模式,直至8月底,屆時我們將重 新評估後續防疫的措施。

再次感謝您的合作,並希望您知道學校正在竭盡所能地保護貴子弟,並且為貴子弟提供了完善又豐富的課程。

MAP Overview

Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) is a computer adaptive test created by NWEA. At TCIS, our elementary students will take the test two times this year: August and May. The results provide us with data that we use to inform delivery of the curriculum to students, and we use the data to monitor students' growth over time.

At TCIS, we test reading, language uses, and math. MAP is an adaptive test. This means that the test questions adjust depending on the student's responses. Therefore, no two students take the same test. MAP provides us with a snapshot in time of where the student is. The test is not timed, but generally takes 60 - 90 minutes to complete each test. It is not a race. Encourage your child to take time to read each question carefully.

When preparing to take the test,

Preparing for MAP - Tips for Parents

- Make sure your child has a good night's sleep.
- Be on time for school
- Remind your child to focus and take the test seriously.
- Let your child know to not to talk to their friends or look around when taking the test.

Parents, please notify the school immediately if your child has any allergies to food or other items.

Cell Phone and Communication Devices Policy for ECE and Elementary



Due to safeguarding and child protection concerns and the distraction they cause to learning, at TCIS' early years and elementary levels, we discourage cell phone and communication devices being brought to school. However, we realize that afterschool, parents sometimes wish to communicate with the child when picking them up.

We ask that all students leave their devices at home, however, our policy is that if a student does bring a communication device to school, he/she must give it to their homeroom teacher at the beginning of the school-day. The teacher will keep the device until the end of the school-day and hand it back to the student when they line up for pick-up.

We strongly advise parents to place a sticker with their child's name on their device. TCIS is not responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged devices.

We classify communication devices and any device that allows a student to send or receive communications of any kind from person outside the school.

Communication devices include:

- Cell phones
- Smart watches
- Tablets
- Any device that meets our criteria

In Case of Emergency

If there is an emergency, do not message or call your child's device. Please immediately call the school directly.

Birthday Cupcake Procedures and No Food Deliveries Policy



At TCIS, we understand that children and parents wish to celebrate birthdays with classmates. It is a big day! While we do allow children to bring in cupcakes to share with classmates, we do have procedures in place that need to be followed.

Please note, no soda, no full birthday cakes, or candles are allowed, as it takes too much time for us to cut and distribute cake to students and to clean up. Of course, candles are dangerous and present a serious fire risk.

These steps need to be followed:

- The cupcakes must come to school with the student when he/she arrives at school. **Deliveries are not** allowed under any circumstances.
- The cupcake will be given to the homeroom teacher in the morning and kept their office
- Do not provide any knives to your child to cut the cupcakes.
- Cupcakes will be distributed only during snack time by the teacher and/or TA while using gloves
- No loss of class instructional time will be allowed due to the celebration

Note: Please contact your child's homeroom teacher if you do not want your child to eat cupcakes brought to school by another student.

We understand that sometimes parents do not wish their child to take part due to:

- Allergies of their child to certain foods, ingredients, or additives
- Parent dietary restrictions due to religious, cultural, or health reasons

No Food Deliveries Allowed

No food deliveries are allowed to TCIS at any time during the school day. If a student forgot his/her lunch, do not worry, we will make sure to take care of them on that day. However, please do make sure your child has money on his/her card to use in the canteen.

Be Punctual (On Time)

Being punctual is a positive life skill that we teach students at TCIS. Being punctual is a form of respect, self-discipline, and integrity. It is a skill students need to navigate through their school lives. Parents are vital in developing this character trait in their child. Punctuality is required of our students, as well as our staff.

Traffic can be a challenge for all stakeholders at TCIS, and no one tries to be late on purpose. Therefore, it is very important that everyone has a plan to arrive at school on time. Plan on arriving at school on or before 7:20am. It is better to be early than late.

If a student is tardy, they will receive a reminder email from the homeroom teacher on that day notifying the parent of the tardy. A second tardy will result in another reminder email being sent by the homeroom teacher. If arriving late continues, the principal may need to be involved.

We appreciate your assistance in building this important character trait in your child.

After School Pick-up

I must say, our after school pick-up has gone very well for the first week, with almost all parents picking their child up on time. **Well done**, parents!

A reminder that all students must be picked-up before 4:00pm, at the latest. We do not have staff designated to care for students after that time, as most staff will have returned home.

If a student is not picked up on time after school, the parent will receive a reminder email from the homeroom teacher the next day reminding them that pick-up time is before **4:00pm**, at the latest. A second late pick-up will result in another reminder email being sent by the homeroom teacher. If late pick-up continues, the principal will need to be involved, as this is a serious safety concern. During that conversation between parents and the principal, we may suggest other means of getting your child home safely, such as the after-school bus.

We understand that parents' have busy schedules, and we appreciate how much you have assisted us in getting your child home safely.


Sports and After-School Activities

Due to COVID, the TCIS sports program and after-school events are on hold. In addition, our pool is closed until further notice.


We hold a strong belief in the positive attributes in taking part in sports and after-school activities. We look forward to opening them up as soon as restrictions are lifted.

Early Years and Elementary Checklist



- To maintain student and teacher safety, campus is closed to food deliveries (for everyone).
- Parents may not deliver food to the school for their child.
- Parents/visitors who wish to enter campus are asked to schedule an appointment through the registrar or with Ms. Mint for early years and elementary school. The appointments must be confirmed via email before parents enter the campus.
- Masks must be worn at all times, including the classroom.
- Students' temperature is checked upon entrance.
- Late students must check in <u>with the Registrar</u> to receive an "Admit to Class" slip. The registrar is located in the main lobby of the middle school.
- Students must use hand-sanitizer before entering school and before entering each classroom.
- Any shared classroom materials/supplies must be sanitized after each use.
- Teachers and TAs sanitize students' desks before leaving from every class, with the provided supplies and every 90 minutes of the school day.
- Students must remain socially distant at all times.

- All field trips are postponed.
- No more than 4 students in the restroom at any given time.
- Students may take their backpacks into their classroom for each block to avoid groups at the lockers.
- Students may wear a face shield <u>as well as a mask</u> but not instead of a mask.
- Lunch (Students' temperature is checked upon entrance to the canteen before lunch. Students must remain in the Canteen until dismissal by an adult):
 - o Early Years students eat in class.
 - o Grades 1 to grade 4 eat in the canteen.

Excused Absences

For an Absence to be Excused, a parent must email/call in the absence within 24 hours. The reason for the absence must be supported by the factors outlined in the attendance policy:

- Illness with medical documentation
- observation or celebration of a religious holiday
- recovery from accident with medical documentation
- required court attendance with court notice
- death in the family
- other absences that may be deemed acceptable by the Head of Schools or Designee

Unexcused Absences

If a parent does not email/call in the absence, the student is marked as absent without excuse.
