Advocates	<p><b><u>Continue outreach and engagement with legislators!</u></b>          You have all now given your pitches, but the advocacy doesn't stop there!</p> <p><b><u>Remember:</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The goal is to get a legislator(s) to introduce your bill by January 14th.</li> <li>• Use the "pitch session" slack channel to connect with legislators, send follow up information, and gauge interest in who wants to carry your bill.</li> <li>• Be creative in how you get legislators attention: use social media, press releases, write letters, etc.</li> <li>• Once a legislator has agreed to introduce your bill, you will need to work with them to draft your bill language. Bill language is due Jan 24th.</li> <li>• If legislators did not introduce your bills, have no fear! You will now find bills that your firm would like to support/oppose for the next conference. 	<p>There are two sets of guidelines for your office to work on this year as we build our new program. Take some time to think about both:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Continue your review of our existing <a href="#">election rules</a>. You'll share your notes and thoughts at the next conference. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◦ You should be thinking both about virtual program rules and what rules look like once we're back in-person. What rules govern campaign visits? Do rules limit conduct? Do they encourage one kind of conduct by limiting another? How much consideration should be put towards equity issues? For example, what rules govern in-person delegation visits. Does it matter whether candidates have equal access to a car? Have money for gas? Have their driver license? Are from a delegation further from others?</li> </ul> </li> <li>• In addition to election rules, we'd like you to think about lobbying rules. In real life, there are limits on how lobbyists can interact with policymakers. And there's a lot of transparency requirements. Since we're moving towards an advocacy model for Y&amp;G, should we consider implementing transparency rules? What would make sense?
