Overall Goals for students in this class:

- Be a successful individual and student!
- Prepare for the 8th grade History STAAR test.

Expectations:

Students are expected to come prepared to learn each class period.

Students are expected to have a *charged* laptop, pencil, spiral, paper and folder each class.

Class Procedures:

Technology Policy
