#### **LEADERSHIP**

- A. Is a leader in several kinds of activities. Is often asked ideas and suggestions. Is looked to by others when something must be decided.
- B. Takes initiative. Shows independence of action. May be bossy.
- C. Motivates and/or influences others. Is sought out by other children for play or work group.
- D. Carries responsibilities well.
- E. Entrepreneurial ability: readily making money on various projects or activities.

#### **CREATIVITY**

- F. Curious and alert. Asks a lot of questions; generates many, sometimes creative, ideas for problem solving; has original ideas and varied interests. Flexible in approach to problems.
- G. Risk taker. Will risk failure, try new things willingly. Does not fear being different.
- H. Possesses an aptitude in art, music, acting, writing, and/or verbal storytelling. Very imaginative.
- I. Advanced/keen/subtle sense of humor. Understands jokes, puns and other humor that peers may not "get."

## ADVANCED ACADEMIC ABILITY

- J. Advanced reading or math level; generally 1 or 2 years above grade level. Has advanced vocabulary and/or knowledge base when compared with others of his/her own age, experience or environment.
- K. Learns rapidly, easily and with few repetitions. Usually excels in one or more subjects. Retains what is learned. May become bored with routine assignments or impatient waiting for the group.
- L. Ability to think on higher levels or more in-depth than peers. Asks perceptive and sometimes challenging questions. Classroom performance or grades may not reflect ability (i.e. underachievers).
- M. Transfers concepts and learning to new situations; ability to make inferences and see connections between seemingly unconnected ideas and activities.

### MOTIVATION/TASK COMMITMENT

- N. Shows persistence and commitment to getting task completed. Has a long attention span for activities of interest.
- O. Understands topic in-depth; asks unusual questions for age: asks questions that reflect thinking (Why? What if?) or about abstract ideas (love, justice, etc.) Shows a desire to learn.
- P. Chooses difficult tasks. Will select more challenging topics/materials/issues.
- Q. Becomes enthusiastic about learning; does not want to quit. Can tune others out. May appear to have boundless energy (sometimes labeled hyperactive)
- R. Interests both wildly eclectic and intensely focused (may know large amount of information about an unusual topic, or advanced and varied information about one specific topic)
