

Scholarship

Players are referred to as student-athletes for a reason. Good athletes know how to work hard and persevere. Our academic expectations are a 3.0 G.P.A. Grades will be checked once every two weeks. If a player has dropped below that level, correspondence of a resolution plan must be given to one of the coaches, signed by the player, parent and teacher. If this problem is not resolved, a probation period, as determined by the coaches will be implemented. A student-athlete will not remain an athlete if the probation period expires and no resolution has been made.

Attendance

To be a dedicated athlete, one must be in attendance. For each absence, a player must run four miles to replace the physical training that takes place at a two-hour practice. Additionally, the player must have contacted a coach DIRECTLY (cell phone: 8017912247) before practice begins. Additionally a player may miss challenge matches determining their position on the team. These cannot not be made up but later challenges will occur. Practice times are strictly adhered too. Plan your schedule accordingly. One tennis practice is at least 4 miles of running and sprinting. Plan to make that up the next day for unexcused attendances.

Eligibility

In addition to the scholarship and attendance components listed above, there are other requirements that make a player eligible to play and compete. All paperwork must be done to register my athlete. Additionally, coaches must have physical possession of the following.

*a physical *4nd quarter grades *fee receipts: participation and uniform(after tryouts) *signed disclosure documents

Competition

A high school tennis team consists of 7 players on varsity, 7 players on junior varsity. The remainder of the team are exhibition players. Schools are only required to provide 14 players to compete in the UHSAA. Herriman and other schools have most often carried more players than that on a team. To develop our program, we feel it necessary and important to carry many players on our team.

Concerning competition, those on varsity and JV will always participate on match days. Exhibition players will compete depending upon the numbers provided by other teams. We will attempt to be fair and have all exhibition players compete as much as possible.

Placement and position on the team will be determined by challenge matches and accomplishment of goals as stated on our rubric. As match days and times rotate, the dates of challenge matches will as well. The first week of practice will be mostly made up of challenge matches.
