




Frederick Culling

Killed 14th January 1917



Frederick George Culling was born on the 26th March 1891 in Poplar, London, the son of William Mayes and Donna Laura (née Riches) Culling. His mother was daughter of the landlord of the Bucks Head Inn in Campsea Ashe and his parents moved back to Campsea Ashe sometime around the turn of the century. They lived at Mill House. William was a policeman, initially with the Metropolitan Police Force.

Frederick emigrated to Canada in 1913 and he joined the 47th Canadian Infantry Regiment, number 629486. He served in France and was killed on 14th January 1917 aged 25 years. His memorial is at the Etaples Military Cemetery.
