THE ASSIGNMENT

Students will submit a video news package **created after March 4, 2025.** This means earlier coverage cannot be submitted.

Video News Assignment: Create a video news story that features a student, staff members or school group that has recently won an award. The award could be given by the school, by an outside group or through KSHSAA (like KMEA or DECA or FFA, etc.).

Of course, this contest expects that you act ethically. **Those ethics mean** that you don't use software or Al to deceive your audience or dramatize events in your entry. The entry should be journalistic and strive for truth, accuracy, fairness and context.

SUBMISSION

A Google account is required to submit the entry.

SPECIFICATIONS

The video news entry must be uploaded to the KSPA online submission according to these specifications:

- The entry should be no longer than **90 seconds** in run time. **The** judge will not judge any content past **90 seconds**.
- When you submit your link, you will provide the names of up to four students who created the coverage and your school name
- Posted as an online link that is publicly accessible without password protection (for instance, YouTube or Vimeo). You will simply submit the URL for the entry.
- The use of AI is not allowed.
- The entry should not contain any copyright infringement through the use of audio or video
- The entry must be uploaded by Thursday, April 3 at 5 p.m.



DON'T FORGET

No need to pretend that you attend Sunflower High School, our fictional high school used for other categories. Simply create a video news package as you normally would for your journalism program.
