Appendix A: We've "elected to conduct meetings according to Robert's Rules of Order, as interpreted by [our] group conscience vote. We do this because it allows us to make decisions with a minimum of confusion, and allows a fair representation of opinion from CoDA members. [This] meeting has 5 basic business segments:" The Opening, Reports, Old Business, New Business, & Open Discussion. In the opening, we have the "prayer, 12 Traditions, approval of minutes, newcomer greeter, & Guidelines." Appendix A in the Guidelines "shall be made available at each monthly meeting."

READ The 12 Traditions

FELLOWSHIP Days without events, we have Fellowship after the meeting for about 30 minutes

ANNOUNCE Next meeting date is: 1/11, 2/8, 3/8, Who will open the room and go in person next month to welcome folks? (if no one knows yet, ask later in the meeting again)

SECRETARY Is the Secretary audio-recording the meeting for note-accuracy? Not mandatory. Recording deleted after minutes completed.

NO CROSSTALK For safety, please use "I" statements. No unsolicited advice/ governing. Please ask how a person or the group feels instead of deciding for them.

INTRODUCTIONS & VOTING MEMBER COUNT OFF Currently we have 28 meetings, 10% or 2.8 GSRs, Officers, or Chairs in attendance = quorum (enough voters to have a meeting)

NEWCOMER GREETERS (Ruth & Austin) greeter@lacoda.org - 3 min

We welcome newcomers, give them the Guidelines, help them find answers to questions, & respond to emails during the month. We bring meeting snacks (if we want to). Committee details <u>here</u>.

- Share <u>NEWCOMER WELCOME</u> (**READ ALOUD if there are newcomers**)
- Share <u>GUIDELINES</u>- These reference duty definitions. Appendix A (p. 19) = Meeting Conduct. Article 7 Section D = the Conduct of Guidelines given to each newcomer.

Appendix A: AT ANY TIME DURING THE MEETING...

- **QUESTIONS** You may interrupt to ask a question by saying, "I have a question" or "Point of Information." Your question must be answered before the meeting continues.
- **POINT OF ORDER** You may interrupt if you think the meeting is being conducted improperly by saying, "**Point of Order**," and stating your complaint. The Chair must address your complaint and take appropriate action before the meeting continues.
- **OVERRIDE THE CHAIR** You may challenge a decision made by the Chair (ie a time limit, ruling, other decisions) by saying, "I move to override the Chair's decision." An immediate vote is taken without discussion, & a two-thirds majority overrides.
- **30 SECONDS** If a member(s) engages in unsafe behavior by not respecting the boundaries of others, or someone perceives that to happen, any member may call for a **"Time out"** or **"Thirty seconds."** Everyone ceases talking and spends time seeking guidance from Higher Power. After 30 seconds, someone calls "time," and members may choose to say the Serenity Prayer before resuming the meeting.

I forgot to write to the SAA person who mass emailed without BCCing and ask them to BCC next time and that the email breaks Traditions.

INSURANCE

Michelle, former GSR for the former Malibu meeting suggested I ask SoCal if they had insurance we could get in on, so I asked and they didn't. But they pointed me to San Diego who also doesn't have insurance we can go halfsies etc on, but they shared their experience, strength and hope, see below.

I also asked Andrew at Hollywood Adventist if there are other 12 step groups there we could share insurance with and he said there are currently no 12 step groups there (bc of the new insurance policy). He also said an option is to get insurance per event.

So my next step is to take SoCal's advice and reach out to Leigh from the insurance company they use.

To be clear, I'm looking for insurance that is affordable and trustworthy to host events on the east side at Hollywood Adventist church, where we had the 2019 Sponsorship potluck. They have a large room and free parking lot.

Laurine at SOCAL: We got our insurer, Springbrook Insurance, thru my friend Elaine Allen, who used them for Al-Anon, Area, So California World Service. Al-Anon couldn't use them this year because it got too expensive for the larger numbers of groups they had to insure for.

They remain reasonable for our 30 meeting San Diego Community group, about \$400 +/ year, I think. Would have to confirm w/ treasurer. I forget the dollar amounts it covers, but covers meeting, events, special events, even picnics/ bonfires at the beach they said. Groups need to be official meetings.

Springbrook handles insurance for non profit groups. We are not officially non-profit so Springbrook had to do our insurance thru another company, subcontracting it (I forget the proper term).

We've been happy with service we receive. Leigh is person I talk to. She always sends certificates immediately. Tho' process is changed recently and we are still waiting on our certificate for St. Dunstan's Church for our Holiday party Dec. 14.

The real test is if we have to put in a claim but luckily haven't had to do that.

My info' including phone number is listed below, after Leigh Shelton's info.

Don't email me if you want an immediate response. Text is better and immediate. I have eye problems and wading thru 100's/ 1,000's of emails is harder than looking at occasional text.

When I first started looking some years ago, I contacted a lead in Northern Calif near Sacreamento - no response. I also talked to an insurance co. on the coast, Encinitas, maybe, who was responsive but quoting way more than Springbrook. I really liked the previous owner of this seemingly family/ single owner company. The owner talked to me a lot, educating me on things I didn't know about insurance (zip knowledge on my part then and still). Every Time i talked to him I would learn more. Our bad luck, he sold his company about the time we signed on but the new owner, who I tried to call and establish a relationship with never bothered to call back. However, the office manager, Ms. Leigh, has been my consistent, reliable contact.

We figured, if Area Al-Anon would use Springbrook, it was OK for us. So we've been with them 5-8 years or so.

This is probably TMI, but it's been my experience, strength and hope with this company and experience talking to the few insurance companies who responded back then.

Oh, I just remembered something. Keep in mind I have no insurance experience but in talking with SoCal Al-Anon people I did talk/ email with one woman who had lots of insurance experience. I don't remember her name. Would have to scour my emails or text. Elaine might remember her. I can put you in touch with Elaine. She is currently searching for liability insurance for SoCal Al-Anon. She is very sharp.

Appendix A: Old Business is made up of motions tabled from previous intergroup meetings.

- a. Chair restates the motion at hand to be sure it is understood.
- b. Chair conducts pro and con discussion (approx. 1 min arguments).
- c. Chair may extend discussion time, or any member may request an extension of time from the Chair.
- d. Anyone may move to end discussion at any time by saying, "I call the question." A vote whether to end is taken immediately, & 2/3 majority rules.
- e. When discussion has ended, either by a call for the question vote or automatically by expiration of allotted time, the Chair calls for 30 seconds of silence, then conducts a vote on the motion at hand.

NEW BUSINESS

(5 minutes for each motion)

Appendix A: New Business is made up of new motions about proposed sub-committees, activities, events, expenses, items for the monthly mailing, new policy or procedures, changes to existing policy or procedures, etc. NEW BUSINESS MUST BE PRESENTED IN WRITING TO THE CHAIR BEFORE THE START OF THE MEETING. INCLUDE YOUR NAME. [lacc@lacoda.org or chair@lacoda.org]

- a. All new business must be presented in the form of a motion, which is a yes-or-no proposition beginning with the words, "I move that..." or "Motion, that..." If preliminary discussion is needed to clarify a motion, it should take place outside the meeting, not during the limited meeting time.
- b. The Chair and Treasurer may immediately kill the motion if it is determined to be invalid, or if the funds or means needed are not available.
- c. Every motion must be seconded before discussion begins, to ensure that at least one other member wants to discuss it.
- d. When a motion is seconded, the Chair restates the motion.
- e. The Chair opens discussion by asking for an opening argument (1 minute).
- f. The Chair conducts pro and con discussion (~ 1 min arguments).
- g. The Chair may extend discussion time, or any member may request an extension of time from the Chair.
- h. Any voting member may move to table the motion at any time. A vote whether to table is taken immediately and majority rules.

- i. Any member may move to end discussion at any time by saying, "I call the question." A vote whether to end discussion is taken immediately, and two-thirds majority rules.
- j. When discussion has ended, either by a call for the question vote or automatically by expiration of allotted time, the Chairperson calls for 30 seconds of silence, then conducts a vote on the motion at hand.

The meeting will end at 10:45 am, and all Old and/or New Business not addressed by that time will be added to the next LACC Agenda as Old Business.

OPEN DISCUSSION

Appendix A: The final ten minutes of each meeting allows any CoDA member to voice a complaint, grievance, confusion, question, answer, hope, dream, etc.

FELLOWSHIP
