Entries:

Entries are due on Speechwire by <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>February 25th at 5pm</u> (CST). Any student from an AFA-NST District IV member school <u>who has *not* qualified an event at-large</u> may enter that event in the spring district qualifier.

- *Students may enter no more than three (3) events in each flight.
- *Each school may enter a maximum of five (5) entries per event.

Entry Fees:

Entry fees are \$8 for each slot entered. Schools should provide one judge for every six slots entered. Each uncovered slot will be charged \$15. Fees will be calculated Wednesday, February 26th @ noon. Any changes in entry after this time will incur a \$10.00 drop/add fee per slot (exception: any event that qualifies at-large February 24th-28th) and any judge drops will incur a \$50 judge drop fee.

Membership Fees:

AFA-NST membership fees must be paid by member schools to compete in the District IV Fall Qualifier (as per the AFA-NST by-laws). In the past, District IV had all member schools pay through the AFA website. However, to increase transparency and ensure NST membership fees are disseminated to both the district and the NST, all NST member school fees will be added to Fall District Qualifier tournament entry fees on speechwire. The NST membership fee is \$30 when registering for the District IV Fall Qualifier. If you have already paid this year's NST membership fee through the AFA website, please send your payment confirmation to the D4 chair.

Required Forms

At-Large Forms:

At-large qualification verification is conducted on the district level. All digital, at-large student qualification forms must be completed and shared online (via Google Drive or email) with the D4 chair by 5pm on <u>Tuesday February 25th</u> at <u>outzencp@uwec.edu</u>. Updates from tournaments with results February 28 and March 1 can be added after the fact.

Earlier in the semester, all student event at-large qualification forms were shared with the head coach or student of each program. If you are having difficulty finding your form, please email outzencp@uwec.edu

Student Verification Forms:

Student verification forms must be completed and emailed to the District Chair no later than Friday March 7. You can find the verification form on the AFA-NST website. *Please note that it does require your registrar or records office to verify the information, so you will not want to wait until the last minute.*

Anti-Sexual Harassment Education and Training:

Every student, judge, and coach that attends the AFA-NST must complete anti-sexual harassment training and sign the Anti-Sexual Harassment Resource Signature Form prior to the 2025 AFA-NST. The committee will have those trainings and forms available on the <u>AFA-NST 2025 webpage</u> coming soon.

Tournament Rules:

The top three competitors in all 11 AFA-NST events at the Spring Qualifier will count as district qualifiers to the 2025 AFA-NST. If that placement qualifies the student at large, the district qualification will "trickle-down" to the next student. No student that has already qualified an event at-large to the 2024 AFA-NST may enter the Fall District Qualifying Tournament in that event.

All events with 2 or more sections will have a final round. Advancement to elimination rounds will be based on preliminary rank and rate. Ties in preliminary rank and rate mean that all tied contestants advance to elimination rounds. When possible, ties in rank and rate resulting in a final of 8 or larger will be broken using reciprocals to create a final of 7.

Placing in final rounds will be based on predominance of 1's, followed by cumulative rank. Ties in rank in finals will be broken by the following: judges' preference, drop low rate, and cumulative rate.

District IV Awards:

District IV notes two awards for outstanding members of our district, one for students and one for coaches. Each award requires two nominations from two separate schools in order to be put on the ballot for district voting. Nominations for BOTH awards should be shared with District IV chair Chris Outzen by Friday February 28th at 5:00pm

The Kevin Heineman District Student Award

Each year, an outstanding student from District IV is chosen by their peers to receive recognition as an outstanding member of the regional community in memory of Kevin Heineman, a beloved coach at Hastings College who exemplified the true spirit of competition, excellence, and honor. This award is based on the leadership, fellowship, and sportsmanlike conduct witnessed by the students and coaches of the district throughout the nominee's collegiate career.

Each school may nominate two (2) students (only one can be from your own school). A letter of recommendation justifying the nomination must accompany the nomination. **Any student with two or more nominations will be placed on the ballot.** In the case where only one individual is given multiple nominations, that person shall be chosen as the award recipient. Ballots will be cast at the District IV spring tournament. The recipient will be announced at the awards ceremony.

The Larry Schnoor District IV Distinguished Service Award

This award was created in honor of Professor Schnoor to acknowledge the spirit and service of coaches within the district who, like Professor Schnoor, have shown dedication to the health, vitality, and progress of the district, its students and its schools. The award should not be given on the basis of competitive success but on the impact of the individual on the coaches and students of the district through their leadership, interaction, and service.

Each school may nominate two (2) coaches (faculty or graduate assistants) from the district (only one can be from your own school). A letter of recommendation justifying the nomination must accompany the nomination. **Any coach with two or more nominations will be placed on the ballot.** In the case where only one individual is given multiple nominations, that person shall be chosen as the award recipient. Ballots will be cast at the District IV spring tournament. The recipient will be announced at the awards ceremony.
