Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) is a system that many of the buildings in our district use to create a positive, predictable, and safe environment. It is a way to define and teach positive social expectations in different settings within the school day.

Discovery & Hedden use AIM:

Always be respectful, I solve my own problems, Make responsible choices

Fife Elementary uses RISE:

Responsible, Inclusive, Safe, Empathetic

SLMS and CJH use PRIDE:

Prepared, Respectful, Inclusive, Determined, Engaged

A team of district staff will review bus expectations and update them using the PBIS framework.

Transportation has the 3B's: Be Safe, Be Respectful, and Be Responsible.

Schools will introduce the 3B's to our bus riders upon returning to school.

Other information:

PLAN AHEAD: Find an alternative way to get items to school or home:

- Balloons or baked goods
- Glass containers
- Animals, bugs, fish of any kind
- Skateboard, scooters
- Athletic gear (soccer, basketballs)
- Instruments that are unable to fit in your lap

PROHIBITED on the bus:

- Vaping, drugs, alcohol, medications, tobacco
- Weapons
- Aerosol cans
- Perfume/cologne/hairspray
- Using cell phones to take pictures or videos while on the bus.

Note: Devices are silent, use headphones or earbuds.

Note: Bus riders will be assigned seats.

Discipline and conduct referrals:

To ensure the safety of all students, Fife Transportation has established guidelines for student behavior. All incidents will be treated on a case by case basis.

Note: bus rider accounts will be charged up to 300\$ per seat replacement or other equipment damage.
