- New Business-Erin Kyllo (40 minutes)
  - > Enrollment Numbers-Oct. 1 Count Day- 823 Official Number- had to hit projected number of 790- will receive ~&160,000 for extra students
  - > Open Enrollment, Coffee Talks (Nov. 9 and Nov. 15)- New this year to try and attract more students to open enroll-
    - Projected enrollment next year is down to 770 due to 8th grade class being so large this year and smaller 7th and 6th grade classes in this area- seeking to draw in other open enrollment kids if possible to increase numbers for next year.
  - > Staffing Update- EA opening
    - Using 2 long-term part-time subs but still need one more EA
  - > School-wide Fundraiser November 1-9 Goal: \$80,000
    - As of today, \$87,041 with 30 more hours to go
    - Plan for fundraising dollars- flexible seating in pods, speaker system in gym, new blinds, E-sports equipment, new uniforms, embroidery machines, new chromebooks, etc.
  - > School-wide Happenings
    - Winter Sports- Basketball, Wrestling
    - Turkey Trot November 18- school wide at end of the day, points towards pod wars competition

- Passport to Excellence January 19 (Incoming 7th grade students)-
  - In-person, IC rollover of 6th graders from feeder schools will occur in January
- Standing Reports (20 minutes)
  - > Teacher Report-Craig Moody-
    - 8th grade girls basketball going on now- low participation due to club volleyball and basketball
    - 7th grade girls basketball starting Dec 4- expecting good participation
    - School store is coming soon to sell RVMS gear
    - Teacher expressed gratitude for parent community support
    - Overall positive culture
    - 5A and 5B on ballot tomorrow
  - > District Accountability Committee- Molly Gustafson (Molly was sick so Rebecca presented her notes below that she had submitted electronically)
    - -SAC bylaws are in the process of being updated. They are looking for input from SAC's. Contact Siri.gosselin@gmail.com.
    - Susan Meek reported that district-wide, CMAS scores have improved and we have regained our competitiveness with surrounding districts.
    - -There was discussion about how a parent had made a challenge to the book "A Long Way Gone". The DAC reps explained the process by which books are reviewed and recommendations are made after a challenge has been received. It was very interesting. In this case the recommendation was to keep the book in the classroom.
    - -The main topic of discussion was the change to the highschool bell schedule. Danny Windsor made a presentation about it and answered questions. The only thing of note for Ranch View in this presentation was that the recent passage of House Bill 221390 means that any student who earns at least 9 credit hours through concurrent enrollment while still in high school qualifies for a free year of community college. That is something we can let eighth grade families know about to help them plan highschool schedules.
    - -The Winter DAC forum is in the planning stages.
  - > PTS Organization (PIT Crew) Report-Molly Gustafson (Molly was sick so Rebecca presented her notes below that she had submitted electronically)
    - We earned \$100 from restaurant night at Zell's.
    - We sold the most Boo Grams ever and earned over \$1k.
    - So far we have over \$800 in straight donations.
    - We have all our slots filled for donating to the staff breakfast on Wednesday.
    - This is all to say that our parents seem very engaged this year and that the pandemic malaise may finally be wearing off.
    - This month's restaurant night will be at Lazy Dog Bar and Grill. Date will be announced this week.
