


Universal Waste Handling Guidelines

Universal Wastes are recyclable materials that would otherwise be hazardous wastes. NEVER dispose of in the general trash.

Store in closed, labeled containers for no longer than one year.

Universal Wastes include:

 Consumer Electronics or E Waste - computers, monitors, printers, TVs, fax machines, telephones, circuit boards, etc.



- o Remove stands, brackets, etc. to reduce overall weight and costs which are based on weight. Metal parts can add additional weight and may be able to be recycled separately.
- May be placed in open containers due to bulk.

Lamps/Bulbs

 May include incandescent, fluorescent, high intensity discharge, neon, mercury vapor, high pressure sodium & metal halide lamps.

o Broken lamps cannot be handled as universal waste. Place in a sealed container labeled "broken lamps".



Aerosol Cans


o If cans are entirely empty and depressurized, they may be recycled as scrap metal.

Antifreeze

Mixture of water with ethylene glycol or propylene glycol.

Devices Containing Elemental Mercury

 Includes thermostats, barometers, manometers, sphygmomanometers, mercury thermometers, temperature and pressure gauges, and mercury switches.



Pesticides

Batteries

- o Tape terminals on all small batteries to avoid shorting & fires.
- Automotive and other larger lead-acid batteries may be placed in open containers or on pallets (for larger quantities).

DO NOT dispose of or compact Universal Waste with regular trash.

Plan Ahead - Contact your supervisor and EHS at 810-766-6763 to properly dispose of these items. For larger quantities associated with relamping projects, coordinate with EHS to ensure the proper number of boxes and barrels available prior to generating the universal waste.
