

## Bibliography & Note Cards

The next piece of the History Day puzzle depends upon good research. Follow this checklist to stay on track:

- ❑ Read "*Types of History Day Resources*," "*What Are Primary Sources?*," "*What Are Secondary Sources?*," & "*What Are Tertiary Sources?*" and "*Getting Your History Day Project Started*" in your History Day Manual.
- ❑ Remember, you need a **minimum** of 5 primary & 5 secondary resources!
- ❑ You must **vary the type of resources** you include, in other words, you may not have all electronic sources.
- ❑ Utilize the Bibliography and Notes Rubrics on the following pages to check your work.
- ❑ **Your Bibliography (for 10 sources) is due by: FRIDAY, 10/19/24** [You can submit them sooner!]; you submit this via Noodle Tools.
- ❑ **10 Note Cards are due by: FRIDAY, 10/31/25** (also submitted via Noodle Tools).

Step 1: Select Source from drop-down menu.

Step 2: If you have a quote, type it exactly with quotation marks & the author's name & date. \*Quotes require you to paraphrase to explain significance for credit.

Step 3: If your note is about a picture, including the picture in the direct quotation box is a great idea. In the paraphrase or summary section, create your own caption or detail the picture's significance.

Step 4: In the Paraphrase or summary section, record 1 main idea in your own words. It should have detail and be strong enough to use on/in your actual project. At least 1 note card per required resource. Notes should support your thesis or focus on background information on your topic.

Step 5: NOT graded, but a great idea: Title your note cards.
