**A. PBIS 101.** How can we be sure our school is up to date and implementing PBIS with fidelity? Does our staff truly understand the whys and hows of PBIS? How can we correct misperceptions about PBIS and help build collective ownership? What is PBIS, anyway? Whether you're looking for an introduction, an update, a review, or information to support staff understanding, this workshop will provide a comprehensive overview of the evidence-based PBIS framework: Centering equity in systems, data, and practices in order to support positive student and staff outcomes. Participants will have the opportunity to use the Universal PBIS Big Ideas to identify their school's implementation strengths, needs, and next steps.

**C. Integrating Social Emotional Well-being into Early Learning Environments.** This workshop focuses on empowering educators to lean into children's preferences and tendencies for communication, language, play, and social communication. We will explore sensory processing & co-regulation, supporting co-regulation and creating a facilitative environment, implementing classroom-wide and individualized supports as well as create opportunities that foster a growth mindset and collaborative problem-solving during play schemes.

**D. The Restorative Leader: Role-Modeling for Your School Community.** The challenges of being a school leader today are vastly different from what they were even five years ago. Cultural and political division, pandemic-related delays in student learning, and high turnover have made it more important than ever to apply equity-centered, trauma-informed, and restorative principles and practices to the job. Bringing her passion for holistic restorative approaches and experiences as a classroom teacher, administrator, and now coach and consultant, Jessica will lead participants of this workshop through a restorative leadership coaching experience focused on ways to meet the complex and growing demands of school leadership. Beginning with reflecting on our own personal values and leadership approaches, your time will be centered on connecting and sharing with each other, examining a model for restorative leadership, and identifying changes that can be made immediately to strengthen your capacity, skill, and motivation in your role.

**E. Centering Equity within PBIS (Part 1 of 2).** Educational equity means that every student receives what they need to thrive and have positive academic and social-emotional outcomes. But how do we get there? And how do we make sure we're not inadvertently perpetuating inequities and harm? Intentionally integrating equity into PBIS has resulted in decreased inequities in exclusionary discipline, teacher praise-to-reprimand ratios, and academic outcomes across races; improvements in student behavior, school climate, and school connectedness; and increased instructional time. This two-part workshop will provide exploration activities and opportunities to identify and plan feasible and effective ways to explicitly and intentionally center equity within your school's PBIS implementation.

**F. Classroom Practices to Foster Social, Emotional, and Behavioral Growth (Part 1 of 2).** These sessions have been designed to support educators in strengthening their use of evidence-based classroom practices to create positive learning environments. Preventative, proactive classroom practices will be prioritized with some attention to responsive techniques. Participants will have the opportunity to create an action plan, which will support the context-specific application of new skills.

**G. Embedding Function-Based Thinking Within Restorative Approaches (Part 1 of 2).** Through a strengths-based orientation, participants will explore how person-centered function-based thinking and restorative approaches aim to promote inclusion, access to educational and social opportunities, and strategies to strengthen belonging and promote active accountability. In this two-part workshop, participants will gain a foundational understanding of function-based thinking within a trauma-responsive framework, explore relevant research on how to leverage restorative approaches to enhance and align the evolution of PBIS within the school and classroom community and share their experiences integrating Function-Based Thinking within Restorative Approaches by discussing case examples and system-level efforts to promote this work.

- **K. Enhancing and Expanding the Targeted Level of PBIS.** This workshop is designed for school teams to explore how to broaden and enhance the targeted level of PBIS. Teams will learn to keep universal features paramount while tightening up, enhancing, and developing new targeted systems, data, and practices that build upon the Universal level. Primary goals include solidifying teaming structures, using a function-based lens to expand your inventory of targeted interventions and supports, and solidifying targeted interventions that avoid the potential pitfalls of "universally individualized" interventions. Several classroom and school-wide examples will be provided.

**L. Running School Teams and Meetings Restoratively.** Based on her experiences supporting schools, Camille believes successful implementation of any relationally based approach is hindered or helped by the degree to which the approach is practiced by the adults in the buildings or district. Too often schools implement positive and restorative approaches with students without first focusing on the culture, climate and practices of the staff. In this workshop, Camille will offer a model for running staff meetings, PLCs, and other committees based on the restorative "Balance in the Process." She will offer real examples from schools she is currently working with to demonstrate what it looks and feels like to be part of a restorative culture and provide time to identify ways to make your meetings more restorative and effective.
