Lesson 17: Desire and Need

たい form

This is the "I want to" verb form. Simply take the masu stem of a verb and attach $t \in U$.

📌 Reminder that a ます stem of a verb is a verb conjugated into ます form but ます taken out.

```
Group 1: Godan verbs (u)
```

飲む

飲みます

飲み+たい

飲みたい = I want to drink

Group 2: Ichidan verbs (ru)

食べる

食べます

食べ+たい

食べたい = I want to eat

Group 3: する verbs

勉強する

勉強します

勉強+したい

勉強したい = I want to study (says no one ever ^^;)

- For negatives, just remove the last い of たい and attach くない
- ❖ For all other conjugations, follow L\-Adjectives' conjugation forms

Examples:

ああ、暑い!なんか冷たい物が飲みたい

ああ、あつい!なんかつめたいものがのみたい

Wow, it's hot! I want to drink something cold

あそこに二度と行きたくない

あそこににどといきたくない

I don't want to go there again.

Change these verbs into t=1\(\text{form}\):

- 1. 入る "はいる" To Enter
- 2. 寝る "ねる" To Sleep
- 3. 復活 "ふっかつ" To revive



Highlight the area above for the answer

欲しい

- 1. Used when you want an object
- 2. 欲しい is <u>usually written in Kana</u>
- 3. It is only used for your personal desires, not for another person's

Sentence Making

Noun + が + ほしい

Note: treat ほしい as an い-adjective

Examples

リンゴがほしい

I want an apple

もっと大きい車がほしいもっとおおきいくるまがほしい

I want a bigger car

今は何も欲しくない

いまはなにもほしくない

I don't want anything at the moment

てほしい

This grammar indicates your request or wish for someone else to do something.

Sentence Making

Target に + Verb in て form + ほしい

Examples

仕事が多いから、誰かに手伝ってほしい。 しごとがおおいから、だれかにてつだってほしい。

Since there is a lot of work, I would like someone to help me.

このエベントには、たくさんの人に来てほしい。このエベントには、たくさんのひとにきてほしい。

I want a lot of people to come to this event.

There are two negative forms of てほしい.

- 1. ないで Form + ほしい ("I wish you wouldn't do X", softer, more indirect)
- 2. て form + ほしくない ("I don't want you to do X", more direct)

✔ TIP: ないでほしい is often used instead of ないでください when asking someone not to do something.

Translate

- 1. I don't want many people to come to my house (use both negative forms)
- 2. I don't want you to go (both negative forms)

Vocab:

たくさん (たくさん) Many/much/a lot 人 (ひと) Person/people 家 (いえ) House/home 来る (くる) To come 行く (いく) To go



必要(ひつよう)

- ❖ 必要 means need/necessity
- Treat it as a noun

Example

少なくとも3人が必要だ。 すくなくとも3にんがひつようだ。

We need at least 3 people.

水道は必要があるすいどうはひつようがある

There is a need/necessity for water supply

急ぐ必要がない。 いそぐひつようがない。

There is no need to rush

? Questions ?

Translate

- 1. I don't need money
- 2. I need you
- 3. There is no need to clean every day (掃除 [そうじ] To clean)
- 4. 謝る必要はない (謝る [あやまる] To apologize)

Vocab:

お金 (おかね) Money 必要 (ひつよう) Necessary/need 君 (きみ) You 毎日 (まいにち) Every day 掃除する (そうじ) To clean 謝る (あやまる) To apologize



Highlight the area above to see the answer

がる

To express other people's wants we have to attach the verb がる to the end of たい and ほしい. がる means "seems like" so you're saying it seems like that person wants X (because you shouldn't assume you know what someone else wants)

Sentence Making

Remove the final い then add がるたい \rightarrow たがるほしい \rightarrow ほしがる

♥Usually, ている is added to express that someone wants that thing at this moment, but when talking about a general tendency to want something/negative form you don't use ている

Examples

いつも出かけたがる! いつもでかけたがる! You always want to go out!

スーさんは食べたがっている スーさんはたべたがっている Sue wants to eat (right now)

ロバートは行きたがらない ロバートはいきたがらない Robert doesn't want to go

お金が欲しがっている おかねがほしがっている You want money
