We've been busy, busy! I've so enjoyed getting to know each of your kids these past few days, and I'm excited about the friendships, collaboration, and support I've seen the students have for each other even so early in the year.

Next, we are studying some great topics right now and kids are confident! I love seeing that. In math, we're working on

multi-digit multiplication, which includes multiplying with decimals, and multiplying up to 4 digit by 3 digit whole numbers.

Your students have a quiz on the 11s facts this Friday. They also have their normal Morning Work to complete that is taken for a quiz grade. They should be all finished with their Monday through Thursday by Friday morning so they can earn an extra 10 points on their Friday quiz. Finally, they are taking a short science test regarding the Structure of Living Things. The most important thing they can study for this in the Living Things Vocabulary in their Interactive Science Journals (composition notebook) in their backpacks. We have been studying so hard and they are making incredible connections between plant structures and human/animal organs and systems. I'm so proud of them!
