SLARTS Gallery- Students will learn and participate in how to run a gallery space. Students will understand 'curating' and display techniques. As a community we will have several themed exhibits. Students will also help rotate artwork that is framed throughout the building.

### What your student can bring to class-

I would like for all students to have an art sketchbook. This sketchbook may be recycled from a previous class, but should have at least 50 plain, unlined pages. It can range in size from 5x7"-8x10". We use our sketchbooks everyday! I will have sketchbooks available if a student is unable to get one.

\* This item will be used during the regular school day. They may be brought from home on a voluntary basis, otherwise, they will be furnished by the school.

We are travelers-

Please know that we will be using our outdoor spaces for inspiration and learning. We will be walking and traveling to exhibits at the downtown library, UMOCA, UMFA and viewing public art.. Art of the Natural World will be outdoors drawing, painting and sculpting often!!

Below is the basic framework we use to learn, be creative and explore in our art studio:

#### STUDIO STRUCTURES for LEARNING

- Teacher presents
- Students-at-work
- Talking about Art
- Showing Art

Choice-based learning allows students to choose their materials, subject matter and/or technique.

#### Rotating Art Stations

Students will have a choice of materials within the rotating stations. These stations will rotate through drawing, painting, lpads, sculpture, multimedia, printmaking, clay, and textiles. We will always have at least three stations open.

#### What our daily class looks like:

- 5-7 minute sketchbook- free draw, prompt, 'How to Bin' or idea starter
- Demo
- Studio Time
- Reflections/table check-in

**Technology Fridays**- photography, digital work and E-portfolios.

'Closed-Studio'- Quiet and Introspective.

'Open-Studio' - Full choice, music, social and treats.

**Field Trips**- We will be getting out of the building to take field trips to see local murals, sculpture or visit The Chase Folk Museum, Utah Museum of Contemporary Art or Utah Museum of Fine Art.

Students will be introduced to skills, techniques, artists, movements, and history that will connect and integrate with other areas of learning as well as spark personal interests.

All classes are scaffold based with materials, techniques, talking about art and showing art.

Students will be given a weekly CAB, PEPR snapshot.
