RYAN PEDON



Pedon has spent the last five seasons at Ohio State after joining the staff in the summer of 2017. In his time with the Buckeyes, OSU has a record of 106-53 with an NCAA tournament berth during each of his seasons in Columbus, with two trips to the NCAA second round.

In 2020, Pedon joined Coaches 4 Change (C4C), an organization founded by college basketball coaches who are dedicated to help their student-athletes, their campus, and their communities. The mission of C4C is to provide a platform that engages, educates, empowers, and evolves the collegiate student-athlete on issues of social injustices, systemic racism, and the power of voting in the endless pursuit of equality.

He made the transition to Columbus alongside head coach Chris Holtmann from Butler, where he had helped the Bulldogs tally a 47-20 record in two seasons with two NCAA Tournament berths in Indianapolis. Prior to joining the Bulldogs he spent two seasons at Illinois as an assistant to the 5 head coach for former Illini head coach John Groce. In his two seasons in Champaign the Illini twice advanced to the NIT. He has also spent time as an assistant coach at Toledo (2010-13) and Miami (Ohio) (2005-10), was director of basketball operations at Kent State from 2002-05 and was a graduate assistant at Miami (Ohio) from 2000-2002. Pedon played college basketball at the College of Wooster, where he was a three-year letterwinner and helped the Fighting Scots to three NCAA Tournaments and three North Coast Athletic Conference (NCAC) regular-season championships. In 2000, he won Wooster's prestigious "Bear Award".

He received his bachelor's degree in communications from Wooster in 2000 and a master's degree in sport organization from Miami (Ohio) in 2002. He and his wife Stephanie have a son, Maddox.

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DENNIS HOPSON



Dennis Hopson was named the third head men's basketball coach in program history at Lourdes in May of 2019.

Entering his 4th year as the Gray Wolves head coach, Coach Hopson's team finished 24-8 last season and won the Wolverine Hoosier Athletic Conference tournament championship for the first time in school history.

Hopson produced a NAIA Honorable Mention All-American in his first season at Lourdes. In addition, he has had three players named First Team All-WHAC and two others garner Second Team All-WHAC honors. He also had a player named to the WHAC All-Freshman Team and the WHAC All-Defensive Team.

His student-athletes have also succeeded in the classroom. Hopson has produced three CoSIDA Academic All-District I First Team honorees as well as five members on the WHAC All-Academic Team. He also has produced four NAIA Scholar-Athletes.

A native of Toledo, Hopson arrived at Lourdes with more than 30 years of basketball coaching, recruiting, and playing experience. Hopson played in the National Basketball Association (NBA) for five seasons. He was the third pick overall in the 1987 NBA Draft by the New Jersey Nets, where he played for three years. He also had stints with the Chicago Bulls, where he won a NBA Championship, and the Sacramento Kings. Following his NBA career, Hopson played seven more years in Europe. Upon retiring from his playing career, Hopson was a regional scout for the Philadelphia 76ers in 2003-2004 before moving into the coaching ranks.

He began his collegiate coaching career at Northwood University, where he served as an assistant coach for two years under head coach Rollie Massimino. He was a part of a NAIA national quarterfinals team in 2007-2008 and helped guide the Timberwolves to a pair of Florida Sun Conference titles.

Hopson spent 2009-2014 as an assistant coach at Bowling Green State University for coach Louis Orr. He was an instrumental member of the coaching staff that helped the Falcons earn a berth in the 2012 CollegeInsider.com postseason tournament.

Hopson spent one season as the head boys coach at Bedford High School and also served as the Director of Basketball Operations for the YMCA of Greater Toledo prior to his arrival at Lourdes.

Hopson was a standout player at The Ohio State University, where he was an All-American and the Big Ten Player of the Year in 1987. He is the Buckeyes' all-time leading scorer, tallying 2,096 points during his four-year career. He also holds the school's single season scoring record with 958 points in 1986-1987, a season in which he finished second nationally in scoring.

A member of the Ohio State Hall of Fame Class of 1994, Hopson was named to the John Wooden Award All-American Team and was named a First Team All-Big Ten selection in 1987.

Hopson received his Bachelor of Education in sports and leisure studies from Ohio State in 2006.
