

The Ember Cast ProtoGuide Experience

Description

One of the core offerings of The Ember Cast is the ProtoGuide experience, specifically designed for high school students. We call it ProtoGuide because the experience combines opportunities to serve with various Ember projects at a Guide level [Guide being what we call our staff] with the deep learning and mentorship similar to a protege program. This experience is one school year long and focuses on the concepts of global missions, world cultures and leadership development. Other core concepts include risk, multiplication, experimentation, long term perspective, catalytic behavior and the utilization of technology. The overall goal is to spawn and multiply a community of high impact leaders from students who burn for the world.

Do Things Like This

Upon successful completion, ProtoGuides will have:

- + Been well informed and equally inspired with regard to major issues surrounding global missions.
- + Understood social dynamics as they relate to culture, worldviews and belief systems.
- + Participated in a number of learning experiments involving creating community and mobilizing peers.
- + Experimented with the art of catalytic leadership.
- + Gained an even greater passion for the world.
- + Contributed at a staff/guide level for helping facilitate an Ember global leadership experience.

Format

- + Reading assignments will be done virtually.

- + Small group discussions once every two or three weeks.
- + Inherent use of technology include blogs, social networking sites, video chat venues.
- + On site experiential experience once a month - selected field observation assignments.
- + The context will be in the suburban Washington, DC area, with access to a myriad of suburban and urban ministry resources. Time requirements are estimated to be 20 hours per month. Remote interns are possible - please contact us for more details
- + The experience is best executed under school mentorship programs - you get credit and time off from school which allows for a greater level of commitment, flexibility and availability.
- + There is a materials fee for each semester, which mostly entails paying for books. Other incidental costs will occur with field experiences such as transportation, and food or snacks.
- + You will primarily mentored by Tony Sheng, founder and principal catalyst for The Ember Cast. You will also get a chance to have deep and significant interaction with selected board of directors from Ember specific to their interests and specialties.
- + If you have a lot of other commitments, this is probably not for you. We are looking for students that have a passion for this kind of learning and make themselves available for it.
- + As of 2018, there is a grant that will pay for most ProtoGuide costs, including some of the costs for being on an Ember team the summer after the experience ends. Most ProtoGuides have historically joined an Ember team when their experience ends.
- + Every year is different, past internships have included serving or learning from activities/ministries such as: DC ServeFest; National Community Church; Church Resource Ministries; Sunday Breakfast Mission; Catalyst leadership experiences; The Bridge, Silver Spring; The M Conference; Humana 2008, Orlando; Urban Youth Worker Institute; Stop Hunger Now food packing event; The Well in Curtis Bay; gatherings with various vocational missionaries from around the world; global missions experiences in Philadelphia, New York, Phoenix, Austria, Hungary, Cameroon, France, The Czech Republic and Italy. Our founder, Tony Sheng, is intentionally deeply involved with every activity around our competencies, honing the craft of discipling global leaders. He runs The Ember Cast bivocationally while also working full time as a database engineer for Oracle America and embraces the bivocational model both as part of his personal ministry philosophy and as a model for future missional leaders.
