Important Dates

- Teacher Assignments: Available online via <u>Skyward Family Access</u> on Wednesday, August 20th.
- Meet the Teacher Night: Join us on Thursday, August 21st, from 5:00 PM to 6:30 PM to meet your child's teacher.
- First Day of School (Grades 1-5): Tuesday, August 26th
- **Kindergarten Smart Start:** Our Kindergarten team will contact you with your child's specific schedule and start date.

School Hours

- Full Day: Doors open at 8:35 AM; school begins at 8:40 AM; dismissal at 3:15 PM.
- Early Release Days: Doors open at 8:35 AM; school begins at 8:40 AM; dismissal at 1:00 PM.

🏫 Arrival & Dismissal

We will continue with the same routines as last year to support a smooth and safe transition for students.

Walking Families (West Side Crosswalk)

- Arrival: Parents walking their children should remain on the west side of the main entry crosswalk—for your child's safety, please do not accompany them across the drive lane. Crossing is supervised during drop-off.
- Dismissal: Parents walking must wait on the west side until staff signal it's safe to exit. Please stay behind the crosswalk barrier until all cars have cleared.

Parent Drop-Off (West Side Car Line)

- Form a single-file car line along the west side of the loop—do not pass, and pull forward as space becomes available. Staff will greet children at the car, open doors, and help your child exit safely.
- Students enter school and proceed directly to classrooms; staff will be on hand to guide Kindergarten students through their first weeks.

Parent Pick-Up (Dismissal)

- At dismissal time, please follow the same car line. Pull forward completely, and turn off your engine.
- There will be staff to assist students. Once your child is safely inside, please exit promptly to allow others to pull up.

Early Pick-Up Procedures

- To pick up a child early, report to the main office, present a photo ID, sign out your child.
- Please ensure that your Skyward contact information is current, and notify the office in advance if someone unfamiliar will be picking up your child.

The Importance of Regular Attendance

1. Academic Achievement

- Students who attend school regularly are about **1.7 times more likely** to reach proficiency in reading and math compared to those with irregular attendance
- Even missing just two days a month can put students at risk of falling behind, accumulating gaps in essential learning

2. Long-Term Outcomes

- **Chronic absenteeism** (missing 10% or more of school days) is a strong predictor of dropping out and lower graduation rates
- Long-term studies show early absence leads to poorer educational levels,
 economic struggles, and less civic engagement in adulthood

3. Social & Emotional Well-Being

- Attending school fosters friendships, self-confidence, and a sense of belonging—all essential for emotional health
- Students who miss or arrive late frequently often feel isolated and disconnected from peers and teachers

4. Negative Ripple Effects

- **Tardiness** disrupts classes. It interrupts learning for all students and forces teachers to reteach missed content, affecting lesson flow
- Habitual lateness can lower GPAs, reduce test scores, and increase disciplinary action.

🚀 Why Even "Small" Absences Matter

- Missing a few instructional minutes *every day* adds up—**18 lessons per month**, hundreds per year—and that can derail student progress.
- Early absence—especially in kindergarten—can lead to lifelong attendance issues and diminished achievement

77 Why Punctuality Matters Too

- **Morning routines** kick-off vital parts of the day: attendance checks, previews, relationship-building, brain warm-ups. Being late causes kids to miss this. .
- Other students lose learning time when teachers must pause to help late arrivals catch up

What Parents Can Do

- 1. **Set firm routines:** Regular bedtimes, early wake-ups, and smooth morning transitions go a long way .
- 2. **Reinforce attendance value:** Talk about how being there every day helps learning, friendships, and future opportunities
- 3. **Identify barriers:** Is it illness? Transportation? Anxiety? Bring issues to school early so they can be solved proactively.
- 4. **Positive reinforcement:** Instead of penalizing lateness, celebrate improvements with encouragement, praise, or small rewards.
- 5. **Work together:** Schools, parents, and community resources can partner to resolve issues like illness or transportation.

V Bottom Line

Being present and on time isn't just about showing up—it's central to your child's **academic success**, **social development**, and **future potential**. Missing school or arriving late doesn't just cost content—it costs confidence, connection, and opportunity.
