UEMR Hospital Immunizations Information

Immunizations:

- Tuberculin skin test performed within the past twelve (12) months of the end of the program or documentation as a previous positive reactor;
- Proof of Rubella and Rubeola immunity by positive antibody titers or two (2) doses of MMR;
- Proof of Varicella immunity, by positive history of chickenpox or 2 Varicella immunizations;
- Proof of Influenza vaccination during the flu season, October 1 to March 31
 - o *If Class is during April-August timeframe, no flu shot is needed.
- Proof of Hepatitis B immunization by positive antibody titers or three (3) doses of Hep B series.
 - If you did not receive this immunization as a child, then the recommended schedule for the hepatitis B vaccine is to receive the first shot, followed in one month by the second shot. Six months following the first shot, you should receive your third and final shot of the series.
 - Rapid Twinrix (Hep A & Hep B) is acceptable. You will receive your second shot 1 week after the first shot, then your second shot 3 weeks two weeks later. Then, you will need to receive a final dose 1 year after the first dose. You may begin clinicals after your third shot at 3 weeks. This is a great alternative instead of the 6 month Hep B shot schedule.
- COVID Vaccine is no longer required. However, we simply need to know whether you've had the vaccine or not as hospitals are tracking that data.
