Welcome to Math 10 with Mr. Goode! We will be using a workbook for this course. See workbook letter for more information. In order to support students in Math 10, consider these tips:

- ✓ Students have access to our course materials on our class website (bit.ly/agoodesite), including filled-in notes and video lessons. See the course outline for our course code.
- ✓ Please read the course outline. All students should have a copy in their binder. There is a great deal of useful information for parents to know. It may be worthwhile to print an extra copy of the outline from Google Classroom and keep it accessible for reference.
- ✓ Students and guardians are able to access marks via MyEd. If you are not sure how to do this, you can visit the district's website for more information. Go to sd61.bc.ca, then "Parent & Student Resources," then "Student MyEd Account" (<https://www.sd61.bc.ca/parent-student-resources/student-myed-account/>).
- ✓ Frequently ask to see that the daily math assignment has been completed and answers have been checked over. Assignments are included in students' notes. You can easily flip through student workbooks to see that assignments are being attempted.
- ✓ One way to help students review what they have learned is to ask them to explain the math they are learning to you, whether you initially remember it or not ☺ Having them re-teach it to you can be a very valuable learning exercise for them.
- ✓ Please send a note to school for any excused absences, or call the school absence line.
- ✓ When students are absent, the next assignment on the assignment list will have information regarding the section in the workbook we are learning and the daily assignment so that students can attempt to learn the information. Notes and videos are posted in Google Classroom.
- ✓ Frequently communicate with your child about upcoming tests and quizzes and help schedule regular study times.
