Video project options (choose one):

**Option 1: How-to cooking video (Demonstration)** 

#### Work in pairs

Task:

Make a short "cooking show" video where you show and explain how to prepare a simple dish.

#### **Instructions:**

- Choose a simple recipe you know (e.g., sandwich, salad, pancakes).
- Show and name the ingredients.
- Show the basic steps and explain them in English.
- Speak clearly and organize your video into introduction, ingredients, steps, and final result.
- You can film at home or use pictures if real cooking is difficult.

## **Option 2: My favorite dish presentation (Speaking + Visuals)**

### Work in pairs

Task:

Create a video where you talk about your favorite dish and describe the ingredients and how it is made.

#### **Instructions:**

- Choose your favorite dish (e.g., sushi, pizza, pilaf).
- Show pictures or draw simple pictures of the dish and the ingredients.
- Explain:
- What ingredients are needed?
- Where is the dish popular? (Is it traditional?)
- Why do you like it?
- You can use a poster, PowerPoint slides, or just objects from your kitchen for visuals.
