



## **MYP SERVICE PROJECTS**

Hello Channing Hall Families,

Our students are doing a great job implementing our Channing Hall vision statement in an effort to improve the world. Some examples of projects already completed include: collection drives outside of school to provide for people in need, helping at food banks, homeless shelters and other community resource centers, reading to younger children, donating or helping at animal rescues, or caring for neighborhood pets. Some families have helped globally by providing support to Ukrainians as they flee their country.

MYP Years 1 and 2 (6th-7th) students are encouraged to design, complete, and reflect on a service project.

### **MYP Service Guidelines**

- ☐ Year 1 and 2 (6th Grade and 7th Grade) students should plan on completing a project.
- ☐ Year 3 (8th grade students) complete a *Community Project* in teams.

### **Process**

- ☐ Your service advisor is your advisory teacher.
- ☐ IDENTIFY and INVESTIGATE- Identify a problem and research possible solutions.
- ☐ Check out some [ideas and examples of projects here](#).
- ☐ PLAN- Fill out the [MYP Service Project Planning Guide](#). This link will automatically make a new copy. Fill it out online and share it with your service advisor and Mr. Webb- or print, fill out, and turn in. Teams can work together on the same document.
- ☐ Add your service activity to Canvas.
  - ☐ Find the MYP Advisory Class on your Dashboard
  - ☐ Find the Service Module
  - ☐ Complete the first assignment.
- ☐ IMPLEMENT- Put your ideas into action! Document the process (take photos, etc.).

- ☐ REFLECT- Fill out the reflection for your project in Canvas (It will be listed in the MYP Advisory Class under the Service Module.
- ☐ Write a paper or Create a poster, slideshow, video, or other product to present your project to your class. We will share some projects in the hallway, morning announcements, and weekly newsletter.
- ☐ You will have check-ins with your service advisor and IB Coordinator (Mr. Webb) throughout the year. All service hours must be completed by May 13.

#### **Answers to Frequently Ask Questions**

- ☐ It is up to you! Some complete their hours all at once and others do things throughout the year. You can do multiple projects.
- ☐ Students and families are allowed to team up.
- ☐ Service should be performed for the community and be something outside the norm. For example, doing chores around the house would not qualify.
- ☐ Political or religious service does not qualify.
- ☐ Some students choose to do complete SPPRAKS- Special People Performing Random Acts of Kindness.
- ☐ Although the school cannot collect funds or donations, you are welcome to do this on your own.
