Learning Target:

"I can use my vocabulary words to create and act out a fun story in Puppet Pals."

Step 1: Getting Started (You Got This!)

Open Puppet Pals:

- Grab your iPad and open the Puppet Pals app.
- Choose at least **two characters**—maybe a student and a teacher, or two classmates.
- Select a backdrop that fits your story—a classroom, school library, or reading nook.

Look at Your Words:

These are your vocabulary words:

• main idea, supporting details, topic sentence, summary, evidence, paragraph, text structure, informational text

Nrite the words down or keep them open on your screen!

Step 2: Plan Your Scene (Use This Guide!)

Use this format to help guide your story planning:

- **Circumstances:** What's going on in your story? Example: Two students are working on identifying the main idea of an informational text.
- Consults: Who do they ask for help?

 Example: They ask their teacher or a classmate who's really good at finding supporting details.
- Consideration: What will they think carefully about? Example: How to find the topic sentence that tells the main idea.
- **Expectations:** What did one character expect to happen? Example: The student expected it to be easy, but it was harder to find evidence from the

text.

- **Destiny:** Does one character feel this is what they're meant to learn? Example: A student believes it's their reading destiny to master informational text skills!
- **Presence:** How does someone entering the scene change the mood? Example: A substitute teacher enters with a silly story and helps them understand text structure in a fun way.
- **Reveal:** What new info or tool helps them succeed? Example: The teacher shows them how to use a highlighter to mark supporting details.
- **Unsure:** What is one character confused about? Example: A student isn't sure if the topic sentence always comes first in a paragraph.

Step 3: Write Short Sentences (Use These Starters!)

Act your story out using short, fun lines. Here are some sentence starters:

- "Given the circumstances, we need to find the main idea of this paragraph!"
- "Let's consult our notes and look for the topic sentence."
- "After careful consideration, I think the summary should include this supporting detail."
- "My expectations were that reading informational text would be easy—but it takes thinking!"
- "I believe it's my reading destiny to conquer paragraphs like a pro."
- "Her presence helped me understand what text structure really means!"
- "I have to reveal something... I actually love nonfiction texts!"
- "I'm still unsure about where to find the evidence to prove the main idea."

Step 4: Practice (Here's How!)

Rehearse by Yourself:

- Read your sentences out loud. Does it sound like a conversation?
- Make sure it flows like a story.

Action Time!

- Move your characters in Puppet Pals while saying your lines.
- Add emotions—confused, proud, surprised, excited—whatever fits your scene!
