

Health / Medical Terms

- medicine (headache - Tylenol/Advil / medication (Dr/pharmacist - days, weeks, year)
- pills / I'm taking the pill (contraceptive)
- have an allergy / allergies (noun)
- cold - I'm cold / I have a cold
- the flu (influenza) / I have the flu (virus)
- pain / painful
 - I have pain in my leg.
 - I have a painful leg.
- sore throat - I have a sore throat.
- glands - I have swollen glands.
- tonsils / tonsilitis

Symptoms & Conditions

- sore/painful - My back is sore/painful
- hurt - My back hurts. (verb)
 - hurt / hurt / hurt
- to cough (cof)
 - coughed (t) (coft)
- worried / worry (v)
 - I am worried **about** my middle finger.
 - I worried about it yesterday.
 - I always worry about my health.
 - What are you worrying about?

Health Actions / Treatment

- take (medicine)
- come back (for a check-up)
- see (a doctor) > Next week, I'm seeing my doctor
- I have an appointment with the doctor.
- I'm going to see the dr. / the dentist
- try (this medicine)

Health Vocabulary - Gap Fill

Last week, I started feeling terrible. First, I had a bad **(1) SORE THROAT** and then my head and body began to **(2) HURT**. I also started **(3) COUGH (cof/coffee) (force air out of your lungs)** a lot, especially at night. I thought it was just a **(4) cold (mild sickness)**, but the **(5) pain (bad sensation)** in my throat got worse every day.

After a few days, I decided to **(6) go to/see the doctor (dr.)** because I was really **(7) worried (stressed)** about it. The doctor said I might have an **(8) allergy (sensitivity)** to something in the air, not an infection. She told me to **(9) take medicine (consume pills)** twice a day and to rest my voice.
