3 - About the Business Partner Organization (8 min)	• All organizations spoke about hiring needs. • Attrition. • Numbers are going up but applications are still low. • Issues are pay, passion for the work, schedule, media scrutiny.
4 - Talent Readiness and Development (8 min)	• The organizations stated that they see applicants who need to work on the following - • Speaking skills, politeness, interpersonal skills, initiating and carrying conversations with strangers, interpersonal etiquette. • Lose the headphones, listen to people, say hi, etc. • Mental and physical readiness for the academy. • Yes and no instead of yeah, nope. Yes sir, no sir, yes maam, no maam. • Be able to take off the police hat when in an off duty, social situation. Not seem robotic • Writing, spelling, grammar. Attention to details in reports. • Use all your senses. Be observant of your surroundings. • Attention to detail in your appearance, body language. • How you interact with people makes your job easier. Eye contact, listening, communication. • Treat every interaction with the PD as part of your job interview. Project a professional appearance at all times.
5 - Program Overview and Capabilities (7 min)	• Lex PD prepares applicants by telling them everything they need to do to prepare for the academy - physical fitness, mental readiness, academic readiness. Some applicants still begin the academy unprepared. They cannot change an applicant's character. Only the applicant can change that. • The standard is the floor - the PT test is the easiest it can be in the beginning. The standards go up from there. • Ofc. Kennedy will send the 9 week PT readiness program that LPD provides applicants with to Mr. Carnes.

6 - Alignment, Logistics, and Partnership Opportunities (12 min)	• UK has a new criminal justice program. Students are encouraged to explore that option as a college major. • LPD has a program that provides an associates degree during the academy. • Lexington Police Explorers program provides students an opportunity to see how the LPD works. • LPD is working on a program to transition Explorers to a paid position until they are old enough to apply to the PD (21).
7 - Next Steps and Ownership (5 min)	• Adding a 3rd year to the pathway at The Hill. • Make the 911 program the first step in the pathway so the order makes more sense. • Have students work with Special Olympics, various 5k runs, charities, Animal Care and Control to become involved in the community.
8 - Closing (3 min)
