TEACHING AAC STRATEGIES CHECKLIST:

☐ Touch symbols/icons on the system as you talk (aided language input)
☐ Model/Respond on the device
☐ Use parallel talk (describe what the student is doing or could be thinking on the device)
☐ Use appropriate wait time
☐ Choose activities that are fun and motivating.
☐ Support use of the device for many pragmatic functions.
☐ Use a prompting hierarchy
☐ Opportunity to explore the vocabulary within the device
\square Increase opportunities including the device in the following identified
activities
☐ Utilize errorless learning activities
\square Sabotage activities for increased communication opportunities (pause
during routines, provide partial materials, keep items out of reach, etc.)
