# What is Crosslink?

Crosslink is a powerful link & file autodetection & automoderation bot;

Designed from the ground up to provide fast, extensive and user friendly automoderation to afford your community a layer of protection hitherto unheard of. It detects and categorises links & files based on several factors, including data from a local database, data provided by 3rd party aggregates including the Google Cloud Platform, and analysis performed by Crosslink. Among these analyses is scam detection for known company domains, redirect resolving and a local and external antivirus for files.

Despite these powerful features, setup of Crosslink is designed to be as straightforward and user-friendly as possible. This documentation will cover the basics to the advanced of configuring Crosslink to fit your community and use-case. It will also document the specifics behind the processes that make Crosslink work for the more tech-savvy readers.

# **Basic functionality & commands**

Crosslink comes with 3 commands, each with a UI system that operates by altering the message the command was triggered with. For example, if the command was **crosslink.config.edit** you would then edit that message (up arrow or right-click then edit on desktop, long press then edit on mobile) to carry out the operation you'd like to execute. Whenever you run a relevant command in edit mode, a list of operations you can edit your message to is shown. The next few sections will detail each command and their operations.

# Help/info command | Requires Admin

To get a list of commands, and a link to the bot's site (<a href="https://panleyent.com/crosslink">https://panleyent.com/crosslink</a>) is displayed. To trigger this command, simply ping Crosslink.

# crosslink.config.edit | Requires Admin

This is the main serverwide configuration command for Crosslink. At the top, you can see toggleable settings;



Enabling this means anyone with the Administrator Discord permission will be immune to any other configuration elements. If a message would normally be deleted but immunity triggers, Crosslink will react according to the category.

# Inherit Discord permissions

This setting applies responses based on the Discord permissions the user posting the link has. If enabled, a user who doesn't have **embed links** permissions in a given channel will have any link they post deleted. A user who doesn't have the **attach files** permission in a given channel will have any link to an image they post deleted. A user who has **attach files** but not **embed links** permission will have any link they post in the given channel deleted.



This setting is rather simple. You pass a channel mention for your chosen channel (e.g. #logs) and crosslink will then log to that channel.




Also rather simple, this toggles whether or not you want users to be informed about their messages being deleted.



When enabled, this compares links sent against known company domains to find and delete potential scam links. For example, Discrod.com would be seen as a scam of Discord.com. This feature is in beta testing and may trigger false positives on rare occasions.



When enabled, this sends file data taken from attachments or links to files and runs it through an antivirus. This feature is in beta testing and may trigger false positives on rare occasions.

# Link categories

Links detected by Crosslink are assigned to various categories based on data from the local database and data provided by 3rd party aggregates. The categories are as follows\*;











Companies

These links belong to known companies that are commonly posted on or implemented into Discord. These are treated the exact same as Safe links but given unique reactions. The list is currently: Discord, Twitch, Twitter, Youtube, Steam, Reddit, Instagram, Amazon & PayPal.



#### Safe

These links are known to be safe/reputable, used commonly and are safe for users to visit. Examples include google.com, imgur.com etc.



#### Suspicious

These links have intermittent safety issues or provide potentially unethical or harmful services. Commonly among these are http only sites that provide paid services, predatory loan services and content hosts with little or no moderation.



#### Unsafe

These links are known to be unsafe, lead to malware, scams or other such dangerous sites. This category cannot be set to Ignore, it must always be at least set to None.



### Unknown

These links are for domains that aren't used enough to have any reputable data on their safety.



#### Invite


These links are for Discord server/bot invites or aggregates for Discord server invites. If invite data can be found, it'll be sent in logs if logs are enabled, example to the right.





# File Categories

Links to files or attachments detected by Crosslink are categorised according to their format types. If you have the antivirus enabled, only non-media files are scanned by the antivirus. If a media file or media subfile is set to Ignore, a single link to that media filetype will be allowed. This is to allow for custom file hosts like those used in ShareX.



Media files include images, gifs, videos and audio filetypes. Setting a response for this category will have all subcategories inherit it's response unless they have their own response set.



#### Images

Image files are, rather simply, image filetypes excluding animated images (gifs/apngs)



#### Gifs

Gifs also include apngs, and will in future cover any new animated image formats.



# Videos/Audio

Videos cover audiovisual filetypes, both common and uncommon.



## Stickers

Discord stickers. Setting this to Ignore does the same as None.



#### Dangerous files

Dangerous files are files that can easily be downloaded and executed/run by end users and archive files where the contents are unclear and potentially malicious. They are also reactively updated to RCE or malware threats related to specific filetypes.




#### Other files

These are files not covered by any of the above categories.



#### Virus files

These are Dangerous or Other files that are malicious according to the antivirus (if enabled). The response for this category must always be at least set to Del/Delete.

### Responses

For each category, a response can be set. The lowest detected link category is responded to if several links are present in one message. The response are detailed below;

#### None

This will have Crosslink react to the message containing the links according to the category. Crosslink does not react with image categories, only link ones. So an attachment would not get a reaction, only a link.



#### Delete/Del

This will have Crosslink delete the offending message and log it or notify the user depending on the settings detailed earlier in the documentation.



#### **%**

#### Kick/Ban

This will have Crosslink kick/ban the offending user and log it or notify the user depending on the settings detailed earlier in the documentation.



#### Ignore

Crosslink will entirely ignore link categories with this response, but the file categories will only alter a delete response in a link to a none response.


# crosslink.config.override | Requires Admin

When carrying out this command, simply pass a valid role or channel ID present in the guild. The command is carried out exactly the same as the above command, but the config is only applied to the channel or role. Roles are prioritised over channels for responses, so if a role is set to ignore a safe link, and a channel to delete it, a user with the configured role who sends a safe link in the configured channel will have their link ignored. Roles are also prioritised according to the server role hierarchy, so the highest role with an override in a users roles has its responses used. You can see a list of overrides in the



main config command. To remove an override, enter its configuration and run the **override-disable** operation.

### crosslink.linklist.edit | Requires Admin

This command allows you to manually set responses for domains, links and guild ID's for invites. For details on the responses, read the details on the responses for the config command above. Links are prioritised over domains, so if: (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=dqw4w9wgxcq) was set as a link to be ignored, but the domain (youtube.com) set to be deleted, the link would be ignored. The linklist is applied to resolved links, so a shortlink or redirect to a link in the linklist will be responded to accordingly. Guilds in the linklist will have their invites responded to according to the response in the linklist regardless of any other configurations. The None option is not available in the linklist configuration. The keywords for kick and

ban in the linklist configuration are delkick and delban respectively.

# Large guilds (100,000+ members):

It's recommended for suspicious, unsafe, unknown and invite links to be deleted; safe links to be ignored; Dangerous and Other files to be deleted; Scam detection to be enabled; Actions to be logged to a dedicated channel for Crosslink and Discord permissions to be inherited for easy future setup. If it's normal for users to send non-media files, setting other files to none and enabling the antivirus would suffice.

# Medium guilds (1,000 - 99,999 members):

It's recommended for suspicious, unsafe and invite links to be deleted; safe links to be ignored; Dangerous and Other files to be deleted; Scam detection to be enabled; Actions to be logged to a dedicated channel for Crosslink and Discord permissions to be inherited for easy future setup. If it's normal for users to send non-media files, setting other files to none and enabling the antivirus would suffice. Unknown links for personal domains may be more common in guilds of this size, so they may be set to none or even ignore.

# Small guilds (1 - 999 members):


It's recommended for suspicious, unsafe and invite links to be deleted; safe & unknown links to be none; Dangerous files to be deleted; Scam detection to be enabled; Actions to be logged to a

general logging channel and Discord permissions to be inherited for easy future setup. The antivirus should also be enabled.

# Exceptions/notes

You may need to zoom in to 200% to see all aspects of this flowchart. You can see a link to the full image here. This does not take into account stickers which are always responded to according to their configured response in the server/override config as relevant. It also does not take into account user entries for the linklist, these are however treated the exact same as URL linklist entries. Scam detection will also delete any detected scam domains and can only be prevented by the domain/link being in an ignore linklist entry or the admin override triggering. Invites that aren't in the linklist are responded to according to their configured response in the server/override config as relevant. If the antivirus is enabled and a virus/crash file isn't detected, the link safety category is used.
