Why does the trip have a homepage?

Google Docs, which is the platform you are currently reading this document with, is flexible for multiple platforms and completely editable on a cell phone. It is the only method I have ever found that allows me to write these logs live, as in while still actively taking motorcycle trips. During the last few trips, I have run into an issue with Google Docs. If a document gets too much data stored on it, such as large image files are simply a ridiculous amount of text, then the document begins loading very slowly. I had to come up with a solution to prevent this from happening.
